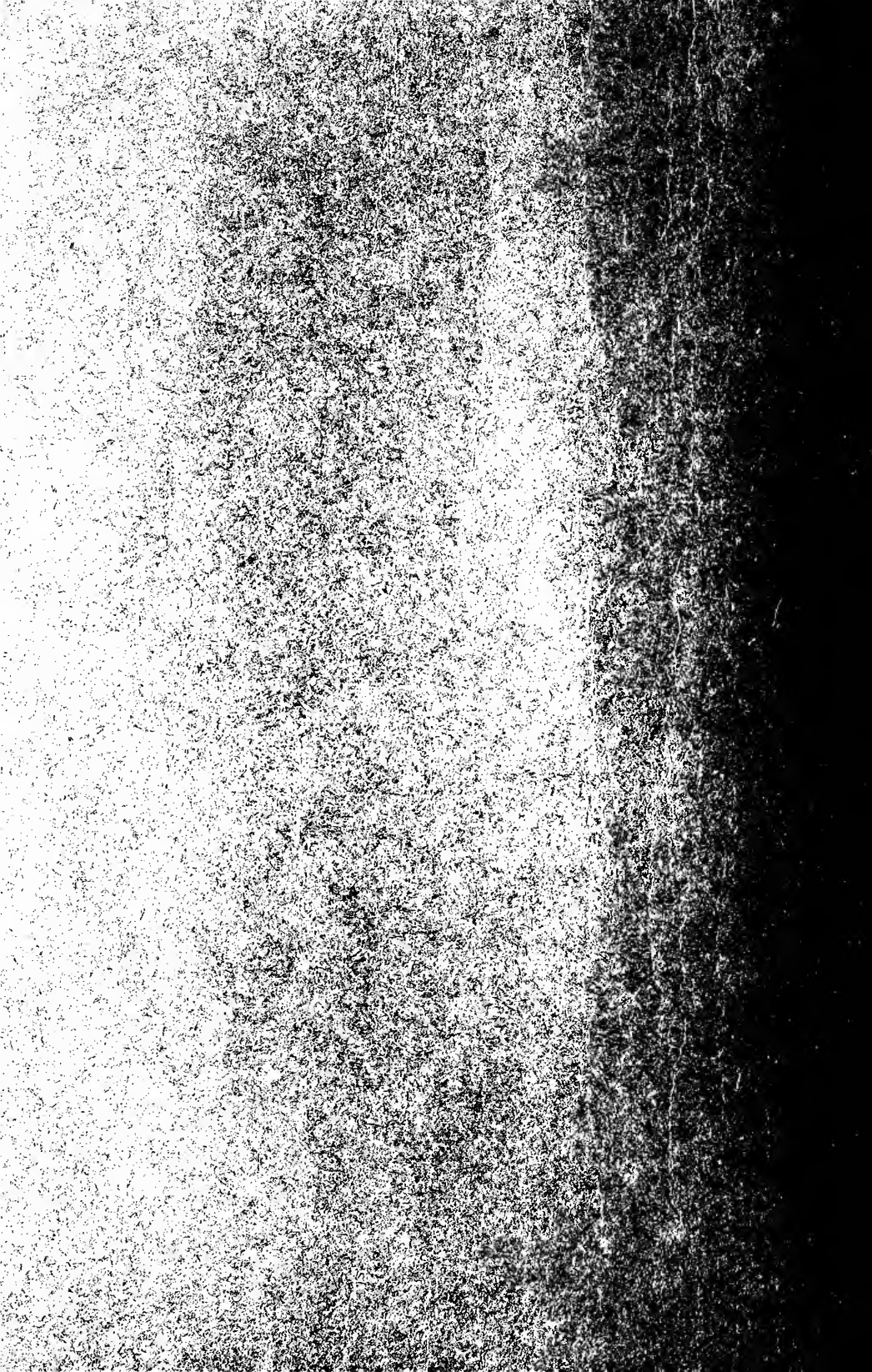

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire,
in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified
to vote in Town Affairs:*

[L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Candia, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To bring in your votes for Councillor in the 3rd District.
4. To see how much the Town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
5. To see how much the Town will vote to raise for Smyth Public Library.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.
7. To see if the Town will vote to make use of the provisions of Section 15, Chapter 84 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire to undertake the permanent improvement of that section lying in Candia of Class One highway leading from Candia to Hooksett known as the Candia cut-off, by raising and borrowing money for same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise such amounts as recommended by New Hampshire Highway Department.

9. To see if the Town will vote to buy tractor, snow plow and summer equipment for use on Town roads and appropriate money for same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to have one Road Agent.

11. To hear the proposition of the State Forester relative to control of White Pine Blister Rust and pass any vote relative thereto.

12. To see what amount the Town will vote to bond the Trustees of Trust Funds.

13. On the petition of eleven to see if the Town will vote to dispense with the Municipal Court of Candia.
