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*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the  
 County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in  
 Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The following Articles will be taken UP AT 8:00 P. M.:

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the use of Smyth Public Library. The money to be expended under the direction of the association.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand dollars for summer maintenance of roads, to be spent as follows:

General expense of Highway Department . . . . .	\$ 500.00
Maintenance of tarred roads . . . . .	3,000.00
Maintenance of gravel roads . . . . .	3,500.00

6. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000.00) for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the town:

such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Candia.

The 1959 appropriation in Article (7) can be applied to the cost, and the amount that would have to be borrowed would be reduced to approximately \$49,600.00.

The State contribution and the amount of money the Town would have to raise each year in order to receive the State aid would pay off the \$49,600.00 in the next nine or ten years.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred, three dollars and fifty-six cents (\$703.56) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute four thousand, six hundred, ninety dollars, and thirty-nine cents (\$4,690.39).

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-five hundred dollars (\$4,500.00) for State Bridge Aid to which the State will contribute thirteen thousand, five hundred dollars (\$13,500.00) for reconstructing Bridge Number 150/121 in Candia Village, known as the Gile Bridge on Route 107B.

Twenty-two hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,250.00) appropriated in 1959.

Twenty-two hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,250.00) appropriated in 1960.



9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one-hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for maintenance and development of Moore Park.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the erection of road-name signs.

11. To see if the town will vote to close the Forgarty Road.

12. To see if the town will vote to close the road from a point 50 feet North of Waldo Glidden's residence to the driveway at the property of Harold Kelley.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars (650.00) for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) for the maintenance of Red Phone Fire Alarm System, for the fiscal year, the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for clearing fire road, under the direction of the Forest Fire Warden.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept a pari-mutuel dog track in event that the State of New Hampshire legalizes dog racing.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the care and maintenance of the town dump, or take any other action relative thereto.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) toward plowing the snow off the Mill Pond at Candia Depot for skating.

19. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.

20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans, in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget, not already acted upon, and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to install a street light at the corner of Route 101 and Maple Avenue.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6:00 P. M., due to re-opening at 8:00 P. M., to take action on the remaining Articles in this Warrant.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

---

### YOU CAN HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Twenty-five per cent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning — brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two-hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you — personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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February 1, 1959

*To the School Board of Candia:*

In submitting my twelfth annual report of the Candia educational system may I express my thanks and appreciation for your kindness and interest in a strong desire to give every child his chance to grow at his own rate of ability and capacity.

At the close of school in June 1958 it was estimated that the extra teachers added during the year could be dropped, but not too long after that date in revamping and re-assigning the children in the first four grades, enrollments were such that it was very undesirable from the educational viewpoint not to continue again without the eleventh teacher. Therefore, at the opening of school on September 4, 1958, Mrs. Sanborn became the teacher in Groups A-B, Mrs. Helena Short of Deerfield was assigned to part of Group C, Mrs. Quimby to part of Group C and part of Group D, and Mrs. Harris to the remainder of Group D, Mrs. Thorell and Mrs. VonHagen divided Grade 4, Mrs. Arlene Contois of Keene was assigned to Grade 5, Mr. William J. Houle of Concord to Grade 6, Mr. Hughin D. Holt of Raymond to Grade 7, and Mr. Lord to Grade 8. As you can readily see we added five new teachers again this year. The teachers who left our system were able to get positions which offered more inducement and greater future financial growth. Also again this year we are faced with the possibility of replacing one or more teachers before the close of the school year.

Because of the new tenure law, we must be prepared for a shifting of teachers earlier this year than last. Teachers who hold certificates and who are not to be renominated or re-elected must be notified in writing before March 15. We shall not have any situation of this nature in Candia, but we shall have to fight it from other districts and other Unions whose superintendents will be looking for our better teachers earlier in the school year. Times change and we are forced to change with them or meet the rising cost of instruction later in the year.

We are developing two or three young men on our staff with administrative possibilities and in all probability these gentlemen will be looking for better positions if not this year, then after next year. This is a situation to which we have to become accustomed unless we are willing to increase salaries sharply.

The second problem which we must face with ever increasing costs on the budget is this item of high school tuition. This item combined with teachers' salaries makes up nearly 80% of present-day budgets. We send our children to two secondary schools — Manchester and Raymond. Estimates show that next fall we shall have 62 children attending Manchester (either Central or West) and 26 children attending Raymond. The rate in Manchester per pupil is, according to the Superintendent of Schools, \$400 while the rate in Raymond will be about \$312. Unless we have a change in the estimate or the rates, the tuition bill for 1959-60 will be \$32,912.00. Why should Candia, or any other school district, pay Manchester \$400 in tuition per pupil per year? The reasons are obvious. It is because of the increased costs in the schools of the City of Manchester — teachers' salaries, equipment, building programs, books and supplies, and the continued revision of the curricula to meet modern life and living.

In looking to the future, please keep in mind the fact that growth in enrollments will be steady and continuous necessitating a revision of your building program very soon; national trends in science, mathematics, and foreign languages will take more and more economical and financial vision; boys and girls will be demanding greater participation in the better things in life — music, art, crafts, and literature; television and radio will be competing more and more in the lives of future citizens of the town; more intensive individualized instruction especially for the gifted child, will be ever present in the building of future budgets; and the requirements of more and more parents to expand the educational development of their children through the medium of high school and college.

May I again express my thanks to you and all those men, women, children and teachers who have helped ease the pressure of the ever increasing problems of modern education.
