You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will adopt amendments to the Town Zoning Ordinance and Building Code as recommended by the Planning Board and on file with the Town Clerk.

The following Articles to be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of the Forest Fire Warden.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow off Hill Pond for skating.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eighty four dollars and forty five cents (\$84.45) to join the New Hampshire Municipal Association or take any other action relative thereto.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

FIRE RECORDS

Fire records are made by people—those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966).

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us: (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres—a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
4. Most important—Instruct your children that matches are not play things.

Instruction in maternal and infant care during pregnancy and after the baby comes is another important service.

The Visiting Nurse is also a health teacher who gives family health guidance.

Mrs. Ethel Partan, R.N. made 40 visits to 9 families in Candia since the United Fund initiated this service in April 1966.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Candia qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School Auditorium in said district on the 11th day of March 1967, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the District will vote to give the School Board the authority to deed to Rockingham Lodge No. 76, A.F. & A.M., or its appointee, for One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable considerations, its reversionary interest in a certain piece of property now owned by said Rockingham Lodge No. 76, A.F. & A.M. of Candia, deeded to said

Rockingham Lodge No. 76 by Henry W. Moore by deed dated June 10, 1915 and recorded in the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds, Vol. 696, Page 333.

10. To see if the District will vote to renew, for 5 years, its "long term contract" with the School District in the City of Manchester, pursuant to RSA 194:21-a, binding itself to pay tuition for such of its students as may attend Manchester High Schools. Renewal to start for 1967-68 school year.

11. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to be made available by the Selectmen prior to June 30, 1967 for support of the schools during the current fiscal year. (Deficit caused by high school tuition.)

12. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$7,100 for the purchase of a school bus. Financing to be arranged by the School Board.

13. To see if the district will vote to allow a child to enter first grade, provided that the child will have attained his sixth birthday on or before December 31 of that same school year.

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SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The continued scarcity of teachers, the increased number of pupils, and the spiral of inflation all cause increased educational costs. As one of the "most needy" of school districts Candia must have more state aid. This year Candia receives \$69,985.94 in foundation aid, about \$5,000 more than last year. If the law now on the books were fully implemented, Candia would receive \$123,760.37 in 1967-68. Another amount of \$8,005 is now received as one of the 20 most needy districts. This is not part of the State Board of Education's program, has always been a special appropriation by the legislature, and could easily be lost. Every effort must be made by the people of Candia to see that state aid is increased considerably so that the property owner does not carry all the burden of increased costs. This is a legislative year and all of us should be active to see that legislation favorable to Candia is passed.

A Title III project sponsored by our supervisory union, but under the direction of the Manchester Institute of Arts and Sciences, has been funded with \$96,600. Candia has already participated in this and will continue to do so for the rest of the school year. In addition to this, we expect the other project, the Psychological Service Center for Pre-School and Primary Grade Children for Rockingham County, will be funded and put into operation sometime this spring. I believe it safe to say that not many school districts in the state will be participating in two Title III projects.

We hope we may have your usual excellent support for your schools.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female - \$2.00
- (2) for a female - \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. 483-8560.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
