## TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

[L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Candia, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Smyth Public Library.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise such amounts as recommended by New Hampshire Highway department.
7. To see if the Town will vote to have one Road Agent.
8. To hear the proposition of the State Forester relative to control of White Pine Blister rust and pass any vote relative thereto.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise by taxation the sum of two hundred and sixty dollars (\$260.00) for the purpose of providing a first quality maple floor in the Town Hall, suitably laid for dancing purposes. Money to be expended in direction of Selectmen.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise by taxa-

tion the sum of one hundred and sixty dollars (\$160.00) for the purpose of providing a first quality North Carolina pine floor for the stage in Town Hall, and to also provide a suitable ticket booth at the entrance to Town Hall. Money to be expended under direction of Selectmen as follows, one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for stage floor, sixty dollars (\$60.00) for the ticket booth.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise by taxation the sum of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) for the purpose of providing a rear Fire Exit from Main stage to ground in Town Hall. Money to be expended under direction of Selectmen.

12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a local town ordinance prohibiting hunting of any kind or the discharge of any fire arm within one thousand yards of any public school house in this town under penalty of not less than fifty dollars and not more than one hundred dollars fine.

13. To see if the Town will vote to enforce on poll taxes in accordance with Section 19, Chapter 60 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.

14. To see if the Town will vote to contract the remainder of the High Street road when it is built.
