## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to be used for the maintenance of fire apparatus and building and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc., the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the use of the Smyth Public Library Association, the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for white pine blister rust control, the money to be spent in co-operation with and under the direction of the State Forestry Department.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and thirty-five dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$535.69) for Town Road Aid, to which the state will contribute two thousand one hundred and forty-two dollars and seventy-five cents (\$2,142.75) or raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred and seventy-four

dollars and fifty cents (\$874.50) for a Secondary State Highway System to which sum the state will contribute one thousand seven hundred and forty-eight dollars (\$1,748.00) to be expended on the Chester Turnpike.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,250.00) for summer maintenance of roads and bridges, and the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for general expenses of the highway department.

8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to purchase new snow removal equipment, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

9. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received the past year.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand and twenty dollars (\$1,020.00) for the maintenance of street lighting.

11. To see if the town will instruct the tax collector to make a charge of twenty cents additional on poll taxes after October first.

12. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors' deeds or otherwise.

14. To see if the town will vote in favor of the development of one or more sources of water supply for fire protection, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the improvement of Moore's Park, such sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen.

16. To see if the town will pass any vote relative to the maintenance of watering troughs.

17. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to include in the budget each year a sum equal to one half the cost of fighting forest fires the preceding year.



18. To see if the town will vote to abolish the Municipal Court. By petition of G. H. Perkins and thirteen additional voters. (This question appears on the regular ballot, and will be voted on at the time of electing town officers).

19. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for the same.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Through the Work Projects Administration many persons have been employed on the Bear Brook Project throughout the year. Two blister rust crews were operated in Candia during the usual season. A project was reopened in the fall by which further improvements were made on the grounds of the Moore School. Following that a considerable number of men have secured work under a road project operated in Candia Village and at the Depot. In addition many persons with low incomes have been materially assisted by the federal programs of distribution of surplus food and clothing.
