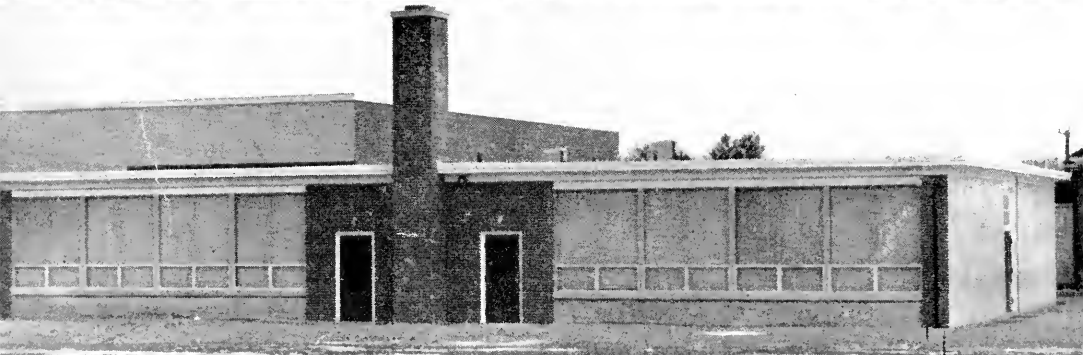
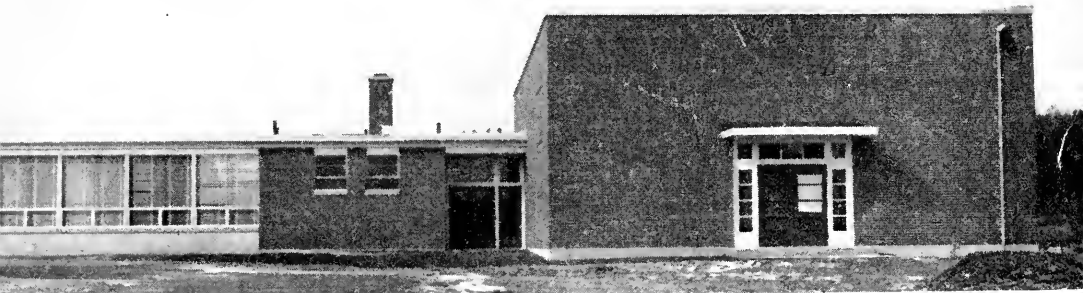

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire,
in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to
vote in Town Affairs:*

[L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the use of Smyth Public Library Association; the money to be expended under the direction of the association.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and seventy dollars and ninety-three cents (\$570.93) for Town Road Aid to which the State will contribute three thousand eight hundred and six dollars and twenty-one cents (\$3,806.21).

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand dollars for summer maintenance for roads and bridges to be spent as follows:

Cutting bushes	\$500.00
General expense of highway department ...	500.00

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for the mainte-

nance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association. The money to be expended under the direction of the association.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the maintenance of RED PHONES fire alarm system for the fiscal year. The money to be disbursed under the direction and supervision of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

9. To see what additional charges the town will instruct the Tax Collector to make on Poll Taxes after October first.

10. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to tar the new drive in Holbrook Cemetery. The work to be done under the direction of the superintendent of cemeteries.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the maintenance and improvements of cemeteries. The money to be expended under the direction of the selectmen and superintendent of cemeteries.

13. To see if the town will vote to sell the Colby lot located on Deerfield road opposite Warren Leonard. Bounded by Mrs. Morgan and Douglas Hayes. The lot to be sold at public auction.

14. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.

15. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the improvement to Moore's Park.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and re-

sources of the town in cooperation with the 37 other communities in this region, or act in relation thereto.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for Fitts' Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the trustees.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the care, maintenance and improvement of the town dump or take any other relative action thereto.

20. To see if the town will vote to install two street lights. One to be located at the junction of Route 101 and the South road. The other to be located at the corner of Brown road and Route 101 near George Gingras.

21. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of the town treasurer fifty dollars (\$50.00) to compensate for additional work namely O. A. S. I. administrative program or take any other action relative thereto.

22. To see if the town will vote to allow the chairman of selectmen compensation for writing up the state head tax warrant and the amount thereof.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls to close at 6 P. M. unless otherwise voted at the meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and wood fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1954.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1955. Let us remember that in any year, over 90 per cent of all fires are caused by carelessness, and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers, and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

(1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.

(2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down.

In automobiles, always use the ash trays.

(3) Report fires and smokes to the warden with delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage, and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 1, 1955

To the School Board of Candia:

May I present my eighth annual report of the Moore School in Candia and at the same time thank the members of the Board for their diligence and perseverance in solving the housing problem as well as the numerous academic problems which have confronted us during the year.

We now have one teacher at least for every grade with a fourth teacher in the first three grades. This came about by the division of grades seven and eight. There is no class at the present time with more than 30 pupils which is the accepted size for the maximum growth of each child. This, of course, is temporary because if the school population continues, and there is no doubt about it, this minimum number will change.

The teaching staff for the Moore School shows Miss Lois B. Hazelton, Principal, Mr. Charles A. Lord, Mrs. Micheline Broadhead, Miss Sylvia Bagdasarian, Mrs. Gertrude Dannis, Mrs. Ethel Von Hagen, Mrs. Martha Guinesso, Mrs. Lois Ann Cosgrove, Miss Rita Beaudette, and Mrs. Gladys Mac-hacek.

Probably the greatest single accomplishment for the year was the construction of a new building housing Grades 6-7-8 plus an auditorium. Unless you have been connected with such a project you cannot realize the issues involved. Credit to the School Board and many individuals cannot be too highly emphasized because it has been a long and not always a pleasant one especially when materials and supplies were scarce and adverse weather conditions tended to hinder progress. Then, too, credit should be extended to the citizens of the town for their desire to insist that the children were properly housed and educated after using all the available space in the older structure.

It is hoped that the citizens of the town will realize that with the new building certain other obligations must also be accepted. Sometimes it is rather difficult to face certain duties when a project of this size is completed. Reference is made, of course, to increased costs. A new building will not take

care of itself and the personnel, supplies, and materials plus needed equipment from time to time must be acquired to carry out, even adequately, the original design for which the plant was constructed.

If you will consult the budget proposed by the School Board, you will see at a glance that at least six items are absolutely necessary for the maintenance and care of a building — janitorial service, fuel, lights and supplies, insurance, debt and interest. These items alone will show, at conservative figures, nearly \$8000 to say nothing about tuition and teachers' salaries, which are almost beyond local control. Please remember, also, that the Town of Candia is growing every year and the time is not too far away when the citizens will have to make a decision concerning its high school pupils. Consolidation of towns or districts for educational purposes on the secondary level is nearer than one would ordinarily think especially with new legislation before the General Court to require all children to remain in school until the 16th year. Then with the increased population caused by the need for more labor — both skilled and unskilled — in the Portsmouth area, one cannot fail to realize the potential enrollments in all the schools in this and surrounding towns.

Therefore, you can almost foretell the problems that must be solved by Candia in the next five to ten years with a debt of nearly \$60,000 to be paid before — if possible — it will again be necessary to seek greater housing space for the future children of the town in education.

And this education will not cost any less, make no mistake about it, if we think only in terms of more children; unless some solution is found to relieve the property taxpayer, the children of the town and every town in the state, will be shortchanged and very fertile ground for unrest and discouragement.

It is my opinion that your School Board realizes these problems and have done everything to hold the budget to a reasonable figure.

Both at the State and National levels effort is already in progress to relieve the burden on the local taxpayer, but with State and National intervention there is also the possibility of curtailment of local power. Perhaps this is what the people of the country desire. You as taxpayers must make that decision. This problem of educational costs is a very serious one and it rests entirely upon the shoulders of the individual citizens of the democracy.

Again, may I thank the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, children and all persons who have contributed to the solution of the town's most recent and one of its most important problems at present — the new building?
