## TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia in the County of  
Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

You are also notified to meet on Friday, the eighth of March, next at eight o'clock in the evening at Moore School Auditorium to consider the following articles:

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty Five Dollars (\$3,585.00) for operating expenses of The Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. These funds to be expended under the direction of the Association.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for the purpose of installing complete toilet facilities, including hot and cold running water, in The Smyth Public Library in compliance with State and Federal regulations. These funds to be expended under the direction of the Library Association together with additional funds provided by the "Friends of the Library."



5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of American Legion Post #91.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.

7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Federal Revenue Sharing monies the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to complete the construction at Moore Park of a public skating rink with provisions for two doubles tennis courts.

8. We, the undersigned, which are all residents of the Town of Candia, wish to present this petition to the Selectmen of the Town of Candia so that the following may be presented at the 1974 Town Meeting in the Town Warrant for consideration by the Town for passage of the same.

To see if the Town will appropriate from Federal Revenue Sharing monies the following sums of money to be used to improve the ballfield at Moore Park.

1. The sum of \$700 for a 40' x 16' backstop.
2. The sum of \$600 for 200' of 4' chain link fencing.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the Red Phone Fire Alarm System. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for general expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump or take any other action relative thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Eighty One Dollars and Ninety Four Cents (\$881.94) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute Five Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy Nine Dollars and Fifty Seven Cents (\$5,879.57).

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc., to assist in defraying its expenses.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for operating expenses of the Candia Recreation Association. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.

15. To see if the Town of Candia will vote to instruct the Selectmen to enlist the services of the Tax Commission of the State of New Hampshire to revalue all of the taxable property in the Town and raise and appropriate the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) in 1974 to defray approximately 60% of the expenses associated therewith, the balance to be raised and appropriated at the 1975 town meeting.

16. To see if the Town will vote, if Article 15 is adopted, to raise the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) specified therein by applying funds received from Federal Revenue Sharing.

17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Federal Revenue Sharing monies the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to establish a dental program to be known as Operation Tooth Fairy for under-privileged grade school children. Said monies to be matched in like amount by the State of New Hampshire and expended under the direction of the Candia Overseer of Public Welfare.

18. To see if the Town will vote to allocate and appropriate, from Federal Revenue Sharing Funds, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) toward the purchase of a new fire truck by the Candia Volunteer Fireman's Association at a cost of approximately \$40,000.00, the balance of said cost to be provided by said Association and said sum to be expended under the direction of said Association.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept State and Federal Disaster Aid whenever a disaster shall occur in the Town and such aid is available.

20. To see if the Town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received this past year.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

22. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer, or dispose of by auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.

23. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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**REPORT OF THE  
CANDIA VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT**

In 1973 we had 36 calls, 6 of which were false alarms and two were aid to other towns.

This department has thirty-eight regular members and fifteen associate members. Thirteen members attended the Meadowood Fire School last fall. Classes are run by the Fire Chief the first Monday evening of every month. We also have a muster team now which has done well for its first year.

The reason for requesting money for a new fire truck is to keep the department up to the town needs and also for the safety of the firemen. This has been studied and we cannot do it on 4th of July celebration profits.

## REPORT OF THE POLICE CHIEF

This department has received and acted upon 875 calls in 1973. Some of the calls were of a minor nature, others of a more serious nature.

Some people may wonder, what does our police department do for us? Although we are not a full time department, we always have officers who are able to leave their work in order to perform their duties, should an emergency arise. Our officers are dedicated, trained for all possible emergencies, and are as capable as any full time officer.

The time has come for Candia residents to understand and appreciate these police officers who are willing to put their time and personal activities aside whenever an incident occurs and demands their total attention.

No doubt there is much the police officer does that is distasteful to many. Depriving people of their liberty, even by lawful arrest, is rarely regarded as an endearing human act. Therefore, it is not surprising that the actions of law enforcement officers, in their performance of duty, often arises criticism. But the officer has no alternative, he must carry out his legal duties. He must enforce the law, whether it be a domestic quarrel, an act of violence, a motor vehicle complaint, a juvenile problem, etc. These laws must be enforced so that all of us can enjoy the benefits of liberty and justice.

I regret to say, that the human qualities of these men of the law are often overlooked or deliberately denied.

In more than 9 years in the law enforcement profession, I have known hundreds of officers. They are not cold ogres, inhuman, or brutal. No, they are human. They have emotions. If the citizens could see the officer off duty they would realize that he enjoys his family, he faces the sicknesses and tragedies of life, like all of us.

Inconsiderate words or deeds by citizens can offset, and undercut the countless acts of genuine compassion which these officers perform for their community.

I am proud of our police department and I would like the citizens of Candia to look upon their police as friends, as men and women who are human, compassionate and understanding.

The officer of the law should not be feared, but respected for his ability, his fairness, and his humanness. This is the kind of officers we have in Candia today.

We are also fortunate to have many concerned citizens who are more than generous in donating equipment to the department. I would like to give special recognition to Mr. & Mrs. Paul E. Sargeant, The Maiden Funeral Home, Simano's Garage, and all those responsible for making it possible to have our safety calendars printed.

I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to all the citizens who helped in decreasing our burglaries by being alert and reporting all suspicious activities and persons when seen in their neighborhood.

In the closing of this report I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen and my fellow officers. We hope that our department will continue to serve you as it has in the past.

**REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND DISTRICT CHIEF**

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the Fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

The Candia Conservation Commission has begun indexing of open space in the town and has proposed a scenic road be designated. We have begun investigation work concerning the designation of certain rangeways as conservation zones for the benefit of the townspeople. This has been done by commission members alone. We, as a commission, would welcome all conservation projects and ideas proposed by all of the townspeople. Therefore, we extend our invitation to all Candia residents to participate and contribute to conservation in Candia.

JUNE — Proposed acquisition of aerial photos of town.

SEPTEMBER—Discussion of new law concerning scenic roads, Planning Board member.

OCTOBER — Review of government supplied leaflets and materials. Rangeline project.

NOVEMBER — Representation at 8th annual meeting and field trip N. H. Municipal Conservation Commissions.

DECEMBER — Proposal of Chester Turnpike as scenic road.

## REPORT OF CIVIL DEFENSE UNIT

The "Civil Defense Unit," will be known in the future as "C.D. Emergency Services."

The program papers and progress reports for your local C.D. Emergency Services have been submitted and approved by the Department of the Army, Office of Civil Preparedness. This enables us to use surplus property from Concord.

We are currently planning a refresher course for the "Emergency Operations Simulation Exercise" which we participated in two years ago, as well as a field exercise of emergency readiness.

Candia is currently qualified for all Emergency Services grant-in-aid programs as well as the surplus property and excess property programs. As stated by William W. Chenault in a published study on Civil Preparedness Planning, "Pre-disaster education and planning is a difficult task. Few people in a community like to think about distasteful future events. Most people tend to think of a disaster as something that always happens to someone else. This delusion can be quite comforting to people who do not wish to face the possibility of being killed or injured. It can result in their minimizing the importance of pre-disaster planning."

In a wide spread disaster, there is a period of time during which a community must be self sufficient. Unless preparations and planning are accomplished prior to such an event, a manageable situation can quickly become a catastrophe.

At this time I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Board of Selectmen for their assistance and also extend to the citizens of this community who have helped make possible the success of this unit and especially to the Emergency Services personnel who have volunteered their time and efforts for this worthy cause.

This United Community Services association is a home health agency certified to care for medicare patients as well as persons of all ages, regardless of race, creed or ability to pay, who need nursing care or instruction.

Services on a part time basis (with physician's orders) include:

- Skilled nursing care/and or treatment
- Physical therapy
- Occupational therapy
- Speech therapy
- Homemaker Home Health Aide service

There is a fee for service and payment will be discussed on the first visit. Adjustments can be made if full fee cannot be paid. Some patients are eligible to have service paid for through Medicare, Medicaid and other health insurances.

Services at no charge include:

- Maternal and child health guidance and instruction
- Classes for expectant parents (held in Manchester)
- Family health guidance with emphasis on prevention of disease and promotion of healthful living
- Regional immunization clinics yearly

*To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia,  
County of Rockingham and State of New Hampshire quali-  
fied to vote in District affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School in said District on the 1st day of March 1974, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the District.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
8. To see if the School District will vote to indemnify and save harmless, for loss or damage occurring after this vote, any person employed by it, including but not limited to the Superintendent of Schools, any member of the School Board, administrative staff or agencies, from personal financial loss and expense, including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property if the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in the injury, damage or destruction was acting in the scope of his employment or office. (RSA 31:105, effective January 1, 1974.)

9. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to purchase a comprehensive general liability insurance policy necessary to protect the School District and its Officers, Employees, and Administrative Staff against personal liability suits specified in Article 8 above. (RSA 31:107.)

10. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to expend \$4,000.00 for the purpose of land acquisition adjacent to the Moore School.

11. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District officers and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

12. To see if the voters will authorize the School Board to accept on behalf of the District, any Federal or State funds designed to improve educational opportunities. Further, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

13. To see if the District will vote to approve the provisions of, and participate in, the New Hampshire Voucher Project commencing with the school year beginning July 1, 1974.

(So that the residents of the District may be fully informed of the provisions of said Project, the School Board will move that action on this Article be postponed to an adjourned meeting to be held at 7:30 P.M. on April 17, 1974 at the Moore School, and that, following the election of District officers, and agents as provided herein, this meeting be adjourned to said time and place.)

## **SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

In the fall of 1973, the School Districts of Auburn, Candia, Hooksett and Raymond petitioned the New Hampshire State Board of Education for withdrawal from their present Supervisory Unions.

This petition was granted in October and as of July 1, 1974, these four communities will officially be organized as Supervisory Union #15.

The rationale for the establishment of this new Supervisory Union was twofold; one being the cumbersome task of administering eight Districts each with their individual needs and secondly the growth rate factor of the communities.

Within the framework of Supervisory Union #15 will be a Superintendent who will serve as the executive head of the public schools. His responsibilities shall consist of the planning and administering each Districts affairs subject to statutory requirements, regulations of the State Board of Education, and the policies of the local District.

The Assistant Superintendent is to provide services in support of the entire educational enterprise. His major responsibilities will be the employment of personnel, certified and non-certified, and to serve in administrative capacity to principals, department heads, teachers and students.

With the above arrangement, we feel quite confident of providing each District the needed services and it is our intention to have an "open house" within each of the school district in the fall of 1974 to explain in detail the purpose and operation of a Central Office.

## NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female - \$2.00
- (2) for a female - \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00.

Certificate of Rabies shot must be presented when registering dogs.

# **BURNING REGULATIONS**

**STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

## **In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311**

**Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.**

**Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.**

**Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.**

**There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from Donald W. Seward, Forest Fire Warden, Candia. Tel. 483-8629.**

**All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.**

**Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.**

**These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.**
