



MAY 2016

The Candia Recycling Center land-filled **66.27** tons of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) during May of 2016. The Recycling Center also sent out **65.46** tons of C&D debris during May 2016. The Recycling Center processed **131.73** tons of waste during May if 2016.

Recyclables

There was a total of **26** bales created during May 2016 which weighed **17.96** tons, there was also one electronics swap which weighed **2.49** tons. The Candia Recycling Center recycled **20.45** tons of recyclables during May of 2016.

On May 27th one load of metal was sent out, the totals were not yet available.

I will be continuing to seek bids to perform the insulation work, due to the lack of response I will seek outside of Candia as well.

TV fee took affect June first and has drastically reduced the number of TV's which have come into the facility.

Glass recycling is becoming an issue, I am searching for alternatives, but the host site has changed locations and the closest site is now in Wakefield N.H. which has drastically increased the transportation costs.

- 1. A Lucas chest compression machine that provides continuous, effective and uninterrupted chest compressions on cardiac arrest patients.
- 2. Five Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) that are portable electronic devices used to accurately diagnose and treat life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias. Three of these AEDs will be carried in Candia Police Department vehicles while the other two will augment those already in service by the Fire Department.
