Background

Smyth Memorial Building

A gift from the estate of New Hampshire Governor and Candia native Frederick Smyth.

1932-2002 – Served as town library and vacated when the new library was built.

2007 – Smyth Memorial Building added to the New Hampshire and National Register of Historic Places, the only such designation in Candia.

2010 -- Candia Heritage Commission begins planning for possible renovation of the Smyth Memorial Building.

Commission work to date


<u>A Scope of Work document</u> was created with information/input from:

<u>Consulting architect Richard Monahon was hired</u> to create a report on which to base project bids.

The Consultant's Report addressed preservation needs, public use of building, and limited financial resources. It included architectural plans and construction specifications.

Commission work to date

Project bids were formulated and sent to area contractors, with four companies bidding the project. Received bids from three companies ranged from \$230,000 to \$189,000.

The Commission met with the lowest

<u>bidder</u> and through negotiation and careful review of project specs, succeeded in reducing the bid by an additional \$45,000.



Final projected cost (approx): \$150,000
