THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to have a caretaker for Moore's Park.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Smythe Public Library.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to buy an adding machine for the Town Officers and raise money for the same
- 7. To see if the town will vote to deed to the Candia Improvement Club, the lot of land upon which the so called "Corner School" is located, provided the School District

at their annual meeting votes to give the school building to the club. Said land to revert to the town when no longer used by the club.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise such amounts as recommended by New Hampshire Highway Department.
- 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.
- 10. To hear the proposition of the State Forester relative to the control of White Pine Blister Rust and pass any vote relative thereto.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to clearing the snow from such streets as the Sclectmen may designate by using plows or scrapers to make such streets passable for automobiles and to appropriate money therefor.
