

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Candia, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.

4. To see if the Town will vote to have a caretaker for Moore's Park.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Smythe Public Library.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise such amounts as recommended by the New Hampshire Highway Department.

7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate money for Old Home Day.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for roads and bridges. 9. * To see if the Town will vote to appropriate money to break the Trunk Line and State Aid Roads for automobile traffic.

10. To hear the proposition of the State Forester relative to the control of White Pine Blister Rust and pass any vote relative thereto.

11. To see if the Town will appoint a Town forest committee as recommended by the State Forester.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate with C. A. Trefethern and John R. McLane, Administrator of the Estate of H. W. Moore in regard to the sale of the H. W. Moore farm in Candia, and complete in the name of the Town any transactions relative to the same that are deemed wise.
