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

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

#### [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Smyth Public Library.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise such amounts as recommended by New Hampshire Highway department.
- 7. To hear the proposition of the State Forester relative to control of white Pine Blister rust and pass any vote relative thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to enlarge the Holbrook Cemetery by purchasing the Page field on the northerly

side of the cemetery, said field containing four (4) acres more or less, at a cost of fifty dollars per acre and make appropriation for same.

- 9. On the petition of A. N. Cleveland and others. To see if the town will note to install a light in Candia Village, opposite the Baptist Church on the Deerfield road and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 10. On the petition of Robert S. Dinsmore and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and forty dollars (\$140.00) for the purpose of providing a North Carolina floor for the stage in the Town Hall. Money to be expended under direction of a committee of three appointed from the floor at this meeting.
- 11. On the petition of Robert S. Dinsmore and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00) for the purpose of providing a first quality maple floor in the Town Hall, suitably laid for dancing purposes. Money to be expended under a committee of three appointed from the floor at this meeting.
- 12. On the petition of Robert S. Dinsmore and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the purpose of providing an Old Home Day celebration on Thursday, August 22, 1929. Money to be expended under direction of the Candia Grange.
- 13. On the petition of Robert S. Dinsmore and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to be used for the maintenance of the fire apparatus and equipment of Candia Vol. Fire Department, Inc. Money to be expended under the direction of a committee consisting of the chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Chief of the Candia Vol. Fire Department, Inc., and one member of the town auditors.
