#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I.O.O.F. Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the celebration of Memorial Day.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be used for the maintenance of fire apparatus and building and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc., the money to be expended under the direction of the Firemen's Association.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the use of the Smyth Public Library; the money to be expended under the direction of the Smyth Public Library Association.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for white pine blister rust control as a relief measure, the money to be spent in co-operation with and under the supervision of the State Forestry Department.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to appropriate five hundred and forty-nine dollars and seventy-seven cents (\$549.77) for Town Road Aid, to which the state will contribute two thousand, one hundred and ninety-nine dollars and ten cents (\$2,199.10), to be expended on town roads under state su-

pervision, or eight hundred and forty-nine dollars (\$849.00) for State Aid Construction to which sum the State will contribute one thousand, six hundred and ninety-eight dollars (\$1,698.00) to be expended on the Chester Turnpike.

- 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of roads and bridges, including general expense.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to purchase new road or snow equipment and pass a vote relative to financing the cost.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as have been received the past year.
- 10. To see if the town will contract with the N. H. Gas & Electric Co., for the maintenance of street lighting.
- 11. To see if the town will authorize the tax collector to make a charge of twenty cents additional on poll taxes after October first.
- 12. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see what action the fown will take relative to renewing or refunding long term notes.
- 11. To see what action the fown will take in regard to real estate taken over by the town for non-payment of taxes.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to extend the Electric Street Light Service on Critchett Road and Thrasher Road or take any action relative thereto.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to extend the Electric Light Service on Diamond Hill Road or take any action relative thereto.
- 17. Upon petition of Alice G. Hall to see if the town will vote to erect an electric street light at the end of the newly constructed electric service, on the road from Candia Village to South Deertield, and to appropriate money to maintain same.

- 18. To see if the town will vote to install a street light between Candia Corner and Candia Village in front of the residence of George Gilman.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to lay out as a Town Road that section of a highway commonly known as Stump Street at Candia Depot to run as far as new trunk line road.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to provide additional water holes on Route 101B (High Street so called) or take any action thereto.
- 21. To see what action the town will take relative to building a Town Hall, including the use of the insurance money.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to abolish the present system of party politics in town affairs and adopt instead the so called Citizens Ticket System.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and appropriate money for the same.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
