



TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Odd Fellows Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) for Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) as a trust fund. The interest to be used for the care and upkeep of the Holbrook lot in the Hill Cemetery.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be used for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc., the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the use of the Smyth Public Library Association, the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred nine dollars and eighty-five cents (\$609.85) for Town Road Aid, to which the state will contribute two thousand four hundred thirty-nine dollars and forty-one cents (\$2,439.41).

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for summer maintenance of roads and bridges and the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for general expense of the highway department.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to pay the balance and buy the snow plow, which the town has rented.
- 10. To see what additional charges the town will instruct the tax collector to make on poll taxes after October first.
- 11. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received the past year.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand two hundred dollars \$2,200.00) to purchase a new tractor road grader and pass a vote relative to financing the cost.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding sixty-two dollars and sixty-six cents (\$62.66) (1/100th of one per cent of the town's valuation based on the 1946 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with the other 37 communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) to be added to the World War II Memorial Town Hall Building Fund, agreeable to the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160.
- 17. To see if the town will vote an annual salary to the Treasurer of the Trustees of Trust Funds in the amount of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) payable annually.
- 18. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in re-

appraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

19. To see if the Town of Candia will vote to replace street lights that were taken out, and have them put back in their former locations. And raise and appropriate money for the same.

- 20. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
 - 22. This warrant may be incomplete.

Polls to close at 7 P. M. unless otherwise voted at the meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES—IT PAYS!

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire efforts. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal

the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this—

- Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
- Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
- 3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
- 4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
- 5. HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PRE-VENT FIRES—his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Candia:

It is with pleasure that I present to your Board my seventeenth annual report of school organization, and of health and educational activities. Such recommendations, as are included in this report, are prompted by the unprecedented and increasing scarcity of teachers and the growth of pupil enrollment, particularly at the vitally important level of the primary grades.

The only change in the teaching staff occurs in the primary room, where Mrs. Gladys H. Machacek of Candia replaces Mrs. Muriel P. Seavey whose request for release was reluctantly granted last June.

Mrs. Machacek is a graduate of the Fitchburg State Teachers College, and has also completed courses in Boston University and Columbia University. She brings to her work in Candia the valuable experience of some twenty years as a teacher in the school systems of Hackensack, N. J., and Winchester, Mass. Candia is fortunate to have retained during this post-war period teachers of training and successful experience.

In September 1946 the enumeration of children between the ages of five and sixteen years totaled 133. Of this number 101 were enrolled in the Moore School in Candia. Thirteen children, between the ages of five and sixteen years, were not required to enter school this year; one was excused from school attendance, and two had graduated from the Eighth Grade. The remaining 16 were enrolled in public and private schools, high and elementary, in the city of Manchester.

Ten tuition pupils from Deerfield were in attendance in the Moore School, making the total enrollment 111 children.

The delayed opening of schools in September, due to the prevalence of poliomyelitis in the state, is reflected in the average achievement of the primary and intermediate

grades, The Metropolitan Achievement scores, expressed in "Grade and Month," give below the grade averages for the last four years.

These scores, particularly in the Fourth Grade, indicate a definite need for a remedial teacher to be employed at least half-time. In rare cases in this state a full-time supervising principal is employed as the remedial teacher in buildings with a pupil enrollment no larger than that in the Moore School.

Following recent investigations of the relation between handwriting and proficiency in acquiring reading skill, a modified form of manuscript basic handwriting has been adopted in the First Grade. It is intended eventually to continue this system through the Second and Third Grades. In the intermediate and upper grades the Zaner-Bloser Correlated Handwriting has replaced the Houston System for which materials are no longer available.

Through the excellent film library now maintained by the University of New Hampshire, and with the Bell and Howell SOUND-ON-FILM projector, purchased by Candia in conjunction with four other districts in this Union, visual education is made a part of the classroom procedure in teaching geography, history, health, music, safety and science.

The annual spelling contest, that was discontinued by restricted transportation during the war, has been restored this year. This contest is open to all pupils in grades three through eight in the schools of this Union. A trophy cup is held for a year by the district whose team of three members has the highest total score. Any district, having won the contest three times, holds the cup permanently.

During the year ending in June, 107 children were examined by the School Nurse, Miss Margaret E. Cronin, R. N. Of this number 25 were given the toxoid treatment for diphtheria, and 18 were given the T. B. Patch Test. Two children were X-Rayed by Dr. Kerr. Communicable diseases included 4 cases of chicken pox, 8 of measles and 18 of "German Measles." Only three children were found to be

more than ten per cent underweight. Corrections were secured for the four cases of defective vision. Nearly 70 per cent of the children were found to have dental defects.

Approximately 40 per cent of these were corrected.

The frequency with which poliomyelitis seems to appear, where dental conditions are poor, is encouraging the adoption by schools of the fluorine treatment now sponsored by the State Board of Health. It is not claimed that the fluorine treatment will arrest active decay, but it is designed to check the tendency to decay. The sponsoring of a clinic for the cleaning of teeth and the application of the fluorine treatment would be a valuable service to the school children.

The visits of your nurse numbered 146 to the schools and 35 to the homes.

Due to the increasing patronage of the school lunches now averaging nearly 100 daily—Mrs. Elizabeth Bean was engaged in November to assist Mrs. Dorothy Ford in this service.

The recently adopted program of federal aid enables Mrs. Ford to serve a complete lunch at a "below-cost" price to the school children. The lunch, consisting of a hearty dish, vegetable, cooked or fresh fruit, bread and milk, actually costs more than 20 cents per individual. For this the children pay 15 cents, and the government contributes 9 cents towards the expense for food and labor. The government also shares the cost of non-food equipment such as the two-unit gas flat recently installed in the kitchen; also included in government aid is the cost of necessary utensils for kitchen and dining room.

The superintendent recommends that while the government will participate in the cost of an electric refrigerator, the purchase of such equipment would be a paying investment. We are now finding this true in several other school lunch centers.

The estimated budget for the coming year exceeds by slightly more than two per cent the sum appropriated in 1946. This small advance of \$201 is accounted for by tuition receipts and by an estimated balance of \$1200 unexpended, chiefly from last year's appropriation for high school tuitions.

Since the present Eighth Grade enrolls 16 pupils and only four high school pupils from Candia graduate in June, it is reasonable to anticipate a larger expenditure under this item next year. Your present contracts for the transportation of pupils will expire in June 1948. In view of pending legislation and the growing popularity of district, or county, ownership of transportation facilities, it is recommended that a committee be chosen to prepare, in cooperation with the School Board, and present to the annual meeting in 1948 price and operating specifications for two or more school buses to be owned and operated by the district.

The enactment of House Bill No. 12, now before the legislature, or of similar bills recently presented, eventually may reduce the local share of school appropriation by approximately \$2000. However, it is not anticipated that these bills will receive final action by the legislature before the date of the annual school district meeting. It appears that the total financial means for the maintenance of the public schools during the year of 1947-1948, must be raised and appropriated by the district of Candia.

In conclusion, I wish to commend the services being rendered by your teachers, the school nurse, and lunch workers to the schools and thus to your community. Your janitor has taken such keen pride in the care of building and grounds that your school plant has won frequent recognition by the State. The spirit of loyalty to the American system of education has been shown by the parents and other citizens. The cooperation extended to the Superintendent and teachers by the members of your Board and by the people of the community is sincerely appreciated.
