TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the nineth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars, (\$100.00), for Memorial Day.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars, (\$200.00), for the use of the Smyth Public Library Association, the money to be expended under the direction of the association.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and ninety-six dollars and forty-three cents, (\$596.43), for Town Road Aid to which the State will contribute three thousand, nine hundred and seventy-six dollars and twenty-two cents, (\$3,976.22).

TOWN ROAD AGENT'S BUDGET

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand dollars, (\$6,000.00), for summer maintenance for roads and bridges to be spent as follows:

Cutting bushes	\$500.00
General expense of highway department	500.00
Maintenance of town tarred roads	1,425.00
Maintenance of gravel roads and bridges	3,575.00

- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00), for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, the money to be expended under the direction of the association.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$275.00),

for the maintenance of RED PHONES fire alarm system for the fiscal year. The money to be disbursed under the direction and supervision of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

- 8. To see what additional charges the town will instruct the Tax Collector to make on poll taxes after October first.
- 9. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to accept the new tomb which has been erected in Halbrook Cemetery.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen and superintendent of cemeteries, gravel the new drive in Holbrook Cemetery which is necessary for the opening of the west lawn in said cemetery for the sale of lots.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to allow all monies taken in for the sale of cemetery lots be used in the cemeteries, instead of turning it over for general expense, said money to be spent under the direction of the superintendent of cemeteries and the selectmen.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00), for the maintenance and improvements to cemeteries, the money to be expended under direction of the selectmen and superintendent of cemeteries.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.
- 15. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), to be added to the World War II Memorial Town Hall Building Fund agreeable to the laws of 1943, Chapter 160 and the Session Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty dollars (\$40.00), for improvements to Moore's Park.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of

publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with the 37 other communities in this region or act in relation thereto.

- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00), for painting and repairs to the Fitts Museum.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00), for the care, maintenance and improvement of the town dump or take any other action relative thereto.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to let Candia Legion Post, No. 91, have a portion of land in Moore's Park for the purpose of erecting a hall.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to construct one half mile of tarred road on the Merrill Road and one half mile on the Critchett Road.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls to close at 6 p. m. unless otherwise voted at the meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Candia:

February 1, 1954

May I present my seventh annual report of the Moore school of Candia and at the same time take the opportunity to thank the members of the Board for their help and understanding in our attempt to solve the problems of the district.

Our teaching staff was increased by two teachers and our children have increased to 236. However, we still have one teacher who is handling nearly 50 pupils—Mr. Kibbee in Grades seven and eight. He is using the largest room in the building and there is hardly any room to place his desks. But there is no room for more teaching space unless we use the corridors. No teacher on the present staff will teach two classes in one room another year and this should be if the group runs above 30 pupils. We are using the teacher's room for our smallest class and after moving all children into the available rooms from the corridors, the administrator of the building has her office in the hall along with the teaching of instrumental music and various remedial classes.

The School District of Candia was fortunate indeed to be able, by applying the new state aid formula, to receive nearly \$20,000.00 in State Aid Money. Since this was almost twice the amount estimated due to the lack of figures, the tax-payers of the town benefited in the reduction of the tax expectancy. The State Aid for next year, according to data received from the State Department of Education, will be \$19,066.18 which is \$123.64 less than this year.

The budget for 1954-55 will be found to have increased in teachers' salaries and retirement. The tuition, which is usually increased is held at the same figure. However, should the state average increase sharply, we have been informed that the Manchester tuition would also increase above the \$300 amount per pupil. The tuition at Raymond has been set at the same figure as last year, \$300 per pupil. One of the reasons for salary increases is the addition of another teacher to split grades seven and eight.

Again may your attention be focused on the housing space at the Moore school. 1954-55 promises to attract an increase

if what the school census shows can be used to foretell enrollments. This coming year should show the largest enrollments in the history of the school — close to 240 pupils — and this number in a building originally built to house 125 at the most.

Plans have been adopted and specifications are being drawn up to add, in an adjoining structure, three rooms and an auditorium. As soon as these specifications are ready, bids will be asked on them and without further delay the building could be nearly completed for occupancy by September 1954.

Suppose, however, that continued delay retards erection such as lack of funds, disagreements relative to building construction, soil and water conditions, failure to be able to get the necessary materials such as steel and hardware, the weather, and perhaps a few others, then space must be found to house at least two classes outside the present building when school opens in September. In some places under similar conditions school has been delayed in opening in the fall for a month or two to allow for the completion of housing facilities. This would mean, of course, an extension of the school year into July and even August. Such an arrangement would run into more trouble especially in regard to teachers who take this time to attend summer school, travel, or prepare for the work of the new year.

It is a serious problem, but I hope that the parents and friends of the school and education will weigh the situation carefully before placing in danger the possibility of abandoning the building project regardless of the present situation.

May I again thank the members of the School Board, parents, children and all persons who contributed to educational growth of the children of the town.
