

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, New Hampshire, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L.S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the use of Smyth Public Library Association; the money to be expended under the direction of the association.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and eighty-one dollars and eightyseven cents (\$581.87) for Town Road Aid to which the State will contribute three thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine dollars and sixteen cents (\$3,879.16).

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand five hundred dollars for summer maintenance for roads and bridges to be spent as follows:

7. The undersigned citizens of the Town of Candia, all bona fide residents and taxpayers, do hereby respectfully petition the honorable members of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Candia, to insert in the official Warrant for the next annual Town Meeting, the following Article, with the request that it be voted upon and decided by the legitimate voters present at said Town Meeting:

To see whether the Town of Candia shall appropriate and allocate in its budget for the ensuing year, an amount sufficient to provide for an all-weather (tar) surface on Patten Hill Road from that point where the tar ends at the residence of Harold Mullen to that point where the tar begins at the residence of Mrs. Alice Emerson Boyson, a distance of eight-tenths (8/10) of a mile, under a project begun three years ago whereby the entire road was to have been surfaced:

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association. The money to be expended under the direction of the association.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the mainte-

nance of RED PHONES fire alarm system for the fiscal year. The money to be disbursed under the direction and supervision of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

10. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the maintenance and improvements of cemeteries. The money to be expended under the direction of the selectmen and superintendent of cemeteries.

12. To see if the town will vote to limit the sale of cemetery lots to residents and property owners in the town of Candia.

13. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.

14. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the improvement of Moore's Park.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with the 37 other communities in this region, or act in relation thereto.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for Fitts' Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the trustees.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the care, maintenance and improvement of the town dump or take any other relative action thereto.

19. We, the undersigned are petitioning the Selectmen of the Town of Candia, to insert an article in the Town Warrant of the 1956 March town meeting, to install a street light, to be located at the junction of the South Road and Route 101 State Highway, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

20. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of each selectman twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year and that of the Relief Agent twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year.

21. To see if the town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make study of the town's development and report to the town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the town's best development. The board members shall consist of one selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) which sum will be used by the New Hampshire Marine Memorial Commission to assist in erecting a memorial for our Army, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard lost-at-sea heroes.

23. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls to close at 6. p. m. unless otherwise voted at the meeting.

#### FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

#### BE A GOOD CITIZEN — COOPERATE

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 per cent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955 — 235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 per cent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 per cent. This is inexcusable.

Everything possible is being done officially to remedy the situation. Since 1909 there has been a statute on our law books which requires everyone to secure written permission from the local forest fire warden before starting a fire in or near woodlands or where fire can be communicated to woodlands unless the ground is covered with snow. A never ending program of educational work is being carried on by your local warden and state officials to inform the general public both of the value and necessity of securing the required permit for such burning. Much progress has been made, but there are still many who fail or refuse to cooperate. The value of our permit system was definitely proven in this district during the 1955 calendar year. Local wardens issued ..... permits for debris burning fires. That's a lot of permits. The records show only ..... permit fires got out of control. This proves several things -- while wardens were liberal in the issuance of fire permits, accommodating every applicant so far as possible, they were cautious, following closely directives outlining overall policy governing the issuance of burning permits and thoroughly instructing permit users. The latter, too, fully appreciating their responsibility in using their permits, governed themselves accordingly. Result? Much burning done legally and safe.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ashtrays. Why not nse them. The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual forest fires would be eliminated. WILL YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

#### REMEMBER

- 1. Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
- 2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
- 3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 1, 1956

#### To the School Board of Candia, New Hampshire:

In presenting my ninth annual report of the Moore School, may I express my appreciation and thanks for the help and guidance extended to me during the past year in our attempt to face the issues which have developed from the local problems and the problems of a wider scope which are growing more and more acute as the changes in modern education are being felt in every part of the country.

It is not only a privilege, but a pleasure, to thank at this time, those organizations and individuals who brought to completion the addition to the school system in the town including the time and energy for a task well done. Men and women from all walks and stations in the life of the town have given advice, guidance, money, materials, and work and are still doing so — for a continuation of a sound and developing educational system, expecting no compensation other than the satisfaction that their children and their neighbors' children may have the opportunities not afforded to them.

To say thanks to these people seems trite and shopworn because future generations cannot thank them sufficiently for what has been so graciously and generously given especially in these times of high costs and increased taxation.

It remains for the sons and grandsons of the present era to maintain and develop a strong allegiance to the fundamentals of a better education in this great land. More power and foresight to them.

Probably one of the greatest problems in modern education and surely the most important, stems from the teaching process. We have felt at times during this past year the frustration of being unable to secure for the children of the town teachers so trained in the fundamentals of child development and growth as to wonder just what is happening to the recruits in this generation in the teaching profession. The teacher shortage especially during the next few years will be the greatest in the history of America. Recent data received from the Office of Education in the State continues to confirm this problem of shortage. Of all the colleges in the State there are but 110 elementary teachers available in June 1956 and only 256 for both elementary and secondary schools.

When it is known that there will be close to 500 vacancies you cannot fail to grasp the enormity of the situation. Added to this predicament superintendents and principals from nearby or neighboring states make yearly junkets to the colleges in this state, not to mention individual schools in the various districts, to appropriate and tempt by attractive salaries, more free time, and a minimum of extra curricula activities to still further reduce the available trained teachers, then one can at least begin to realize why New Hampshire schools have had to scrape the bottom of the teaching barrel.

The law of averages will get each school over this situation for a period of time as well as a few first class instructors, but unless a teacher is willing to sacrifice time and money — I wonder — along with her apprenticeship, it will continue to be a major issue for a number of years to come. Probably the most potent factor in getting and holding good, modern teachers is by the salary route. We are living in a sellers' market as far as teachers are concerned and unless we meet the prices asked, we will continue to get many mediocre and inferior teachers. Here lies the prime factor for so much of the devastating and critical attacks on our schools today.

It is a fact that in the State of New Hampshire all college graduates are asking \$3,000 for their first year out of a 4-year teacher training course. These youngsters realize the shortage in the profession and are beginning to demand a comparable wage with other professions and the workers in other jobs with less training and shorter hours. By 1975 the shortage of teachers will be in excess of half a million even assuming present teaching loads, class sizes, and types of educational programs.

What does this all prove? As I understand it and I am not alone in this knowledge, school boards and taxpayers must increase budgets and make working conditions more attractive if they are to bring to their schools the best teachers for the education of their children. The teacher is the key in the learning process and she is here to stay. Will you get a good one or a poor one? You have the choice.

Another factor which is essential in understanding school costs. This is the problem of tuition. More and more students are going to high school. Statistics from Washington concerning education show that there will be 55 per cent more youngsters in high school in ten years than there are today or 4.2 million. This means that this town and every town will have a higher tuition bill than today and the estimated cost for tuition for next year is close to \$20,000. Project this cost to 1965. Fifty-five per cent of \$20,000 is \$11,000. As a conservative figure your tuition cost will be over \$30,000 in ten years. We shall have from 10 to 15 more children attending high school next year than this year. Look at your enroliments which are growing each year. One cannot fail to see the trend in population and the trend in school costs. Refusing to accept the inevitable in a democracy will lead only to disaster.

Please pause for a moment. In order to grasp the full magnitude of our educational tasks, let us look back to the end of World War II. When this war came to a close we remembered two discoveries which were a legacy, so to speak, from the war period and the preceding decades. The first, of course, on everyone's tongue, was the discovery of the power of the atom. The second, which will not be guessed so readily in all circles, is the power of education. Hiroshima and Nagasaki showed us the power of the atom. Mussolini, Hitler, and Stalin demonstrated the power of education.

Our program has been all out for atomic power — no expense has been held to be too great. Here there has been no hesitation, no uncertainty, no bottleneck.

This is not the case with education. In the last ten years, education has been the most hesitant in the last century. It has suffered devastating attacks. We are torn by conflicts over philosophy, program, and the responsibility of financial support.

In other words, while we moved full speed forward on the means of destruction, we have hardly held our own in education, the only means we have of so changing human beings that the weapons of self-destruction will not be used.

Yes, this entire problem of education in a democracy can be solved only if the people in the democracy are willing to pay the bill.

Again, may I thank you for permission to discuss with you one or two phases of this great problem of undertaking the nature and importance of the educational challenges we all face and hope that the meetings being held next month will accept the responsibilities of a great people for a great country.
