### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

#### [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School in said Candia on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the use of the Smyth Public Library Association; the money to be expended under the direction of the association.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred eighty dollars and thirty cents (\$580.30) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute three thousand eight hundred sixty-eight dollars and sixty-eight cents (\$3,868.68).
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500.00) for summer maintenance for roads and bridges to be spent as follows:

General expense of Highway Department	\$500.00
Maintenance of tarred roads	1,925.00
Maintenance of gravel roads, bridges, and cutting bushes	4.075.00

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volun-

teer Firemen's Association; the money to be expended under the direction of the association.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the maintenance of Red Phones fire alarm system for the fiscal year; the money to be expended under the direction and supervision of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 9. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the maintenance and improvement of cemeteries; the money to be expended under the direction of the selectmen and superintendent of cemeteries.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.
- 12. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the improvement of Moore Park.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for Fitts' Museum; the money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the care, maintenance, and improvement of the town dump or take any other action relative thereto
- 16. We, the undersigners, Walter E. Pitman and 36 others, residents and users of Brown Road in the Town of Candia. New Hampshire, this date October 27, 1956, do hereby petition the town of Candia. New Hampshire to prepare and surface with a hard top finish said Brown Road in the Town of Candia. New Hampshire, the mileage being approximately one mile (1). The points of said preparing and surfacing are:

From the residence of Arthur Perry on the old Auburn Road to the end of the already surfaced portion of Brown Road From the already surfaced Murray Road to the connect-

ing Brown Road.

And from the end of the already surfaced Brown Road leading to Route No. 101, beyond Leo Mitchell's, including both entrances of Brown Road.

Road to be completed in 1957.

- 17. To see if the town will vote to appoint a Zoning Commission of 5 members to make a study of possible zoning regulations for the town, recommend the boundaries of zoning districts and the regulations to be enforced therein, make reports and hold public hearings as provided in Revised Statutes annotated 31:65 and to appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for professional assistance and other expenses thereof; said commission to make its final report at or before the next annual town meeting.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to hold the town meeting at night and same printed on the 1958 ballot.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to turn back a section of the old Route No. 101 which is not in use, to French Sargeant, the present adjoining land owner.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls to close at 6:00 P. M. unless otherwise voted at the meeting.

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 per cent of the forest fires occurring in the State of New Hampshire in 1955

235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 per cent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time accounted for more than 24 per cent. This is inexcusable.

#### REMEMBER

- 1. Get a written permit from our local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
  - 2. Make sure they are dead out before leaving them.
- 3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 1, 1957

To the School Board of Candia, New Hampshire:

May I present my tenth annual report of the schools of Candia and at the same time express my gratitude for your help, guidance, and encouragement in solving the problems of the schools during the past year.

There was a large turnover in the teaching staff for this year. Out of ten teachers, there were six replacements—Mrs. DeMarco, Miss Fellows, Mrs. Harrington, and Mrs. Harris in the primary grades; Mrs. White in Grade four and Mr. Hemphill in Grade 7. Since it is quite early, it is very hard to estimate the number who will return next September. It would be of importance and a great help to the security of the school to be able to retain, if not all, nearly all of a teaching staff for two or three years in a row. Nevertheless, I hope that the number of replacements will be reduced for next year.

Enrollments and tuition students are the most important problems now under consideration and study.

Our schools have registered to date 270 children. This figure should be greater next year by between 15 and 25 pupils which increase our enrollment total to nearly 300 children. These figures show that it will not be too long before an extensive study will have to be made in relation to expansion again. It is a fact that must be faced.

Probably the immediate problem and the one which will have the most attention for the reminder of the year will be the problem involving our boys and girls who wish to attend high school.

Since we send most of our pupils to Manchester and since recent data in the papers, over the radio, and from word or mouth, have informed us that new pupils are to be refused admission to the high schools of Manchester in the fall, it brings out rather vividly the spot in which Candia finds itself come next September. This does not include Candia alone, however. Other towns must face the same problem — Deer-

field, Hooksett, Bedford, and Auburn to name all but one or two.

This situation becomes even more acute within the next four years because, if our youngsters do leave Manchester beginning in September, by 1959-60 all Candia children will have to be housed in schools somewhere. Now, there is but one school within transportation distance to Candia and that is Raymond. By 1960 there would be over 60 Candia children attending high school in Mancheser and at the present time unless Raymond expands, she cannot handle over 25 children more. The nearest schools other than Raymond are Pembroke Academy and Coe-Brown Academy and I know that if Hooksett decides to send her children to Pembroke and Deerfield decides to send hers to Coe-Brown, both schools will be crowded.

There is one solution, but it was not as yet met favorable acceptance. It is the Cooperative School. There is a problem here also and that problem involves new construction. A project of this nature could involve a school plant to house 500 children grades 7-12 if the towns in this area were willing to build such a school as well as willing to work together in studying its possibilties.

It might be possible to work out a plan whereby with a contract with Manchester, we could still send our children to that high school.

The voters of the district should know that board members of Candia as well as the other affected towns are doing everything possible to solve the problem. However, I know any and all of them would appreciate any help.

Again, may I express my appreciation to you for the time you have taken to work out the problems involved for the best interests of the boys and girls of the town.
