TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The following articles to be taken UP AT 8.00 P.M.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Building Regulations as authorized under Sections 2-5 inclusive, Chapter 156, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.
- 1: No dwelling shall be erected, unless in with the following:
- a. Foundations: All dwellings shall be set on solid foundations of cement, brick, stone or other acceptable masonery.
- b. BUILDING: Must be framed according to good buildings practices and outside walls shall be covered with permanent materials customarily used such as wood, or fire resistant shingles, siding, clapboard, brick, stucco, concrete or einder block or other acceptable materials.

c. Minimum Building Area: Every dwelling unit to be by a single family shall have a minimum ground floor area of four hundred square feet.

d. CHIMNEY CONSTRUCTION:

- (1) No chimney shall be built, erected, or altered below the roof unless containing a tile or brick lining and with an iron cleanout door at or near its base, and shall extend at least 18 inches above the peak of the roof. No chimney shall be built, erected or altered below the roof having wood or other combustible materials within one of the chimney and no chimney shall have its base resting upon any floor or base of combustible material.
- (2) No smoke pipes shall be installed or erected so as to be within unless amply protected with non-combustible material. No smoke pipe shall be installed or erected which passes into or through partitions or walls of combustible material, except when guarded by a double collar of metal with air space of at least five (5) inches, or by at least five (5) inches of brick or other non-combustible material.
- 2: Board Of Adjustment: The Zoning Board of Adjustment shall act as the Board of Adjustment.
- 3: Enforcement: The Board of Selectmen shall act as Building Inspectors and the issuance of Building Permits.
- 4: Takes effect: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred twenty four dollars and sixty-eight cents (\$124.68) per year to have installed and maintained a fluorescent street light to be located at the junction of Route 101 and Adams Road. This article is submitted by

the following registered voters of the Town, with the request it be included in the Town warrant.

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the use of Smyth Public Library. The money to be expended under the direction of the association.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under direction of the American Legion Post.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (50.00) for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (50.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and seventy-five dollars (375.00) for the expense of the Red Phone Fire Alarm System. And six hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$625.00) for the expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of the Forest Fire Warden.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow snow off Mill Pond for skating.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (50.00) to purchase advertising space in the 1962 Guide of the Merrimack Region, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the care and maintenance of the town dump, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-five hundred dollars (5,500.00) for summer roads, and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for General expense of highways.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received in the past year.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

- 19. To see what action the Town wishes to take, to raise and appropriate a sum of money toward a 200 year anniversary celebration, in 1963.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6.00 P.M. due to reopening at 8.00 P.M. to take action on the remaining articles in the Warrant.

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First — by setting a good example YOURSELF — being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 1, 1961

To the School Board of Candia:

In submitting my fourteenth report as superintendent of schools in Candia, may I express my thanks and appreciation for the kindnesses received from the board and staff members, as well as the citizens with whom I have had the pleasure of being associated since the fall of 1947.

Again this year we must be concerned with the budget. For a number of years the school budget has absorbed the greater part of the money raised by the town. This is inevitable. However, the two items which are responsible — teachers' salaries and tuition — form 75% of the entire amount to be raised for education. This leaves retirement — \$3,457.05 which is closely related to salaries; debt and interest — \$5,885.00; fuel and janitors' salaries — \$4,250.00; books and supplies — \$3,700.00; and other administrative, statutory, and miscellaneous items.

Our teaching staff still remains at ten full-time instructors, a supervising principal, and two part-time music men. Five of these teachers are replacements. The enrollment is approximately the same as a year ago with estimates that show it will increase slightly in 1961-62. However, the distribution of the youngsters will be a deciding factor in the administration of the school.

There are two classes in Grade 5 with a total of 43 children. But there is classroom space for only one group in Grade 5 in the new building. Then, too, there will be 38 pupils in Grade 7 and 38 pupils in Grade 8. And the census report indicates that there will be very close to 40 young-

sters who will enter Grade One in September. This is a problem that must be solved.

We have reached a period in the school where we must think very seriously of expanding again. If our estimates are correct and we continue to grow in the next five years, then our classroom space will be insufficient and an addition will be necessary. This is much more serious because the classrooms in the old building do not meet modern day specifications. In the building guide published by the State Department of Education it states that each child is entitled to from 30 to 35 square feet of floor space and that a classroom in the elementary school should be at least 850 square feet for not more than 25 children. We have seven rooms in our buildings which house more than 25 pupils each. It is also recommended that in the first three grades more space should be allowed in order that the children of this age may have room to move around freely and work in learning to live with one another.

According to the Per Capita Tax it is costing the district \$82.00 more in 1961-62 than this year which shows that although the number of children in the Moore School was almost constant, the overall number attending both the elementary and secondary schools increased by 41 children.

We are now in the second year of the music program which, under the direction of competent instructors, has demonstrated conclusively the value of its educational need.

Probably the most important recommendation relative to the maintenance of the plant is an overall painting job inside the old building. A few years ago certain floors were sanded and refinished in the old building, but the rest of the rooms were never completed. If these remaining rooms and the corridors were done it would preserve them and lighten the entire building. Perhaps this is the year in which we could make the start.

Last year more hot top was laid. More of this should be done for both a parking area as well as a play area.

In checking the inside of both buildings it was found that in addition to the painting, the replacement of worn out shades and general repairs of the ceilings and walls should be considered carefully.

For a number of years now, in driving past the school and observing the activity of the children at the rear, it has occurred to me that if a driveway could be made in front of the old building, it would not be necessary for buses and automobiles to go around the building. This would increase the safety of the children who never play in front. The children could then board the buses from the front door of the old building and walk over from the new building in safety. A plan of this nature should not be costly and it would greatly protect the children.

It is a great satisfaction to me to know that in purchasing a bus the district has reduced the cost of this item in the budget. The cost of transportation this year will be approximately \$10,400.00 as shown on the 1960-61 budget. However, the amount estimated in the 1961-62 budget is \$7,600.00 This is a saving of \$2,800.00. Credit is due to Mr. Edward Wynot for his untiring effort in making this project operate smoothly and profitably. It is also gratifying to me to see Candia join the towns of Allenstown, Hooksett, and Pembroke in this Union in this important forward step in the transportation of the children of the district.

In the years of my association with the members of the various school boards, I consider it my good fortune to be able to state that every individual elected to the position has been vitally interested in the education of the children of the town and it has been a privilege as well as a pleasure to serve you and your children for the last 14 years. It is my hope that in serving you I have been able to make you cognizant of the magnitude and importance of the problem of education not only in Candia, but also in the state and nation.



NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or spaded female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by July 1st there is an added fee of 50 cents.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. IV 3-7981.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
