To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The following articles to be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the use of Smyth Public Library. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00 for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) for the expense of the Red Phone Fire Alarm System. And one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of the Forest Fire Warden.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow snow off Mill Pond for skating.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to purchase advertising space in the 1963 Guide of the Merrimack Region, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the care and maintenance of the town dump, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-five hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) for summer roads, and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for General expense of highways.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Candia Village Cemetery and the Trust Funds for said cemetery on the same basis as are the Holbrook and Hill Cemeteries.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for removing trees.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc. to assist in defraying it's expenses.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) in 1962, and one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) in 1963 for the 200th Anniversary of the Town of Candia. The Celebration to be held in conjunction with the Fourth of July Celebration of the Candia Fire Department in 1963.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to install and maintain street lights: One to be located at an intersection of Route 101 and Chester Turnpike, and another to be located one thousand feet (1,000) up Chester Turnpike. - 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 21. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6:00 P.M. due to reopening at 8:00 P.M. to take action on the remaining articles in the Warrant.

Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia Qualified to Vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School Auditorium in said District on the 10th day of March 1962, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 6. To see whether the District will vote to construct alterations, additions, and improvements to the Moore School "New Building", so-called, as proposed by the School Board, to purchase necessary equipment and furnishings therefor, and to appropriate for the foregoing the sum of sixty-three thousand dollars (\$63,000.).
- 7. To see whether the District will vote to borrow in the name and on the credit of the District, by issuance of serial bonds or notes, as provided in Chapter 33 of the Revised Statutes Annotated of New Hampshire and any amendments, supplements or revisions thereof, a sum not exceeding sixty-three thousand dollars (\$63,000.) for the purpose of constructing, equipping, and furnishing alterations, additions, and improvements to the Moore School "New Building", so-called, and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which such bonds or notes shall be issued, including the time and place of payment of principal and interest and the rate of interest or discount, and to do whatever may be necessary for the issuance of such bonds or notes.

CANDIA SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

In submitting my first report as your Superintendent of Schools, let me hasten to state that there is much that I do not know, some things I am in doubt about, but that I am sure that we have too many pupils in too little space! Large classes do not tend to permit the best learning situations even when pupils of similar abilities are together. To be sure, a successful teacher can "handle" large groups but the individual pupil will not get the attention to which we feel he is entitled. To aim for 20 - 25 pupils in the lower grades and 25 - 30 in the upper is highly desirable. Even with this aim we know that these numbers will be exceeded in practice. We now have 4 groups over 35.

There is, of course, no easy or inexpensive answer to this problem. Just to provide space and teachers in the years ahead will be a struggle for everyone, not the least of whom is the property owner. Even though within my era as a superintendent the State has come to the aid in building programs (30% of the yearly bond issue) and has a basic foundation aid program for the poorer districts (Candia's share 61-62, \$33,467), these amounts are not enough to stabilize the tax bill, not to mention some tax relief. Yet Candia faces the immediate task of adding basic classrooms to its overcrowded plant. In the process of expansion some thought should be given to larger cafeteria accommodations. To see during a lunch period how the pupils are organized in detail should give you added confidence in your school and cafeteria staff.

Just having enough space and teachers is not enough to have a superior educational program. We, and I mean society as a whole, have need of adults who have had the benefit of instruction in art, as well as music, in some crafts, in physical education, and who have had the counsel of skilled guidance personnel from an early age. We are told that a 30 hour work week is possible. You and I as adults of

50 or over have seen the work week shrink from 54 to 40 hours, or, more to the point, have seen leisure hours increased by almost two of the present working days. We need an adult population with some training in good use of leisure time. Finally, we in Candia (and elsewhere) need a tax structure such that no pupil will be penalized excessively because of place of residence. In the meantime it is our job to get the best educational program possible for your children with the money you may give us! We promise to do our best but it may not be enough.

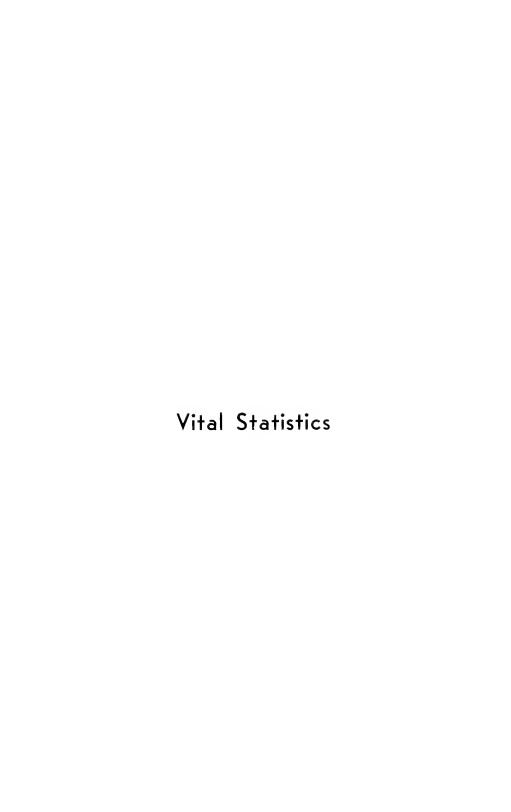

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spaded female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by July 1st there is an added fee of 50 cents.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone IV 3-5111

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. IV 3-7981.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
