TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: (L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the Twelth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The following articles to be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for use of the Smyth Public Library. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00 for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred seventy five dollars (\$375.00) for the expense of the Red Phone Fire Alarm System and one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of the Forest Fire Warden.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow off Mill Pond for skating.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty seven dollars and fifty-six (\$67.56) to join the New Hampshire Municipal Association or take any other action relative thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump, or take any other action relative thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-five hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) for summer roads and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for General expense of Highways.

13. To see if the Town will vote to approve the following conditions governing the building of Roads in Housing Developments in the Town before being accepted by the Town for regular upkeep:

- 1. Right of way on new roads shall have a width of not less than fifty feet (50).
- 2. Road base shall have at least twelve (12) inches of good base gravel, which shall be properly rolled with a road-roller, with an additional of from four (4) to six (6) inches of proper gravel to be added before being black topped.
- 3. Traveled road to be twenty (20) feet wide leaving fifteen (15) foot width on each side for proper grading and drainage. Twenty feet of the traveled road shall be black topped.
- 4. Proper drainage for surface water shall be set up prior to starting road construction.

All work to be built to the satisfaction of the Road Agent and Board of Selectmen.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc. to assist in defraying it's expenses.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an additional one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for Bicentennial to be celebrated this year.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as have been received this past year.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate by auction acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deed.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6:30 P.M. due to reopening at 8:00 P.M. to take action on the remaining articles on the Warrant.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia Qualified to Vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School Auditorium in said District on the ninth day of March 1963, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

6. To see if the District will vote to enter into a "long term contract" with the School District in the City of Manchester, pursuant to RSA 194:21-a, binding itself to pay tuition for such of its students as may attend Manchester High Schools, upon the following terms and conditions:

- (a) *Term*—The current school year 1962-63 and the ensuing four years:
- (b) Tuition—\$395.68 per student for the current year, and for each of the ensuing years a sum obtained by adding a "surcharge" of \$50.00 per student to the operating expense of Manchester High Schools plus two per cent of the capital cost thereof, both to be determined as provided in RSA 194:27 (Supp.);
- (c) Such other terms and conditions as the School Board shall, by its execution of said contract, deem to be in

the best interests of this District and its high school students.

7. To see if the District will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the District (excluding service in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election and service in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis) the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, as Amended; to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.) to defray the Board to execute on behalf of the District the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to implement such plan; and to designate the Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of such plan.

8. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town —

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A brief review of Candia's school enrollment seems to be in order. In 1951-52 the average daily membership was 184, in 1961-62, 303, and this year we have had a registration of 335, although our present membership is about 320. This is an average annual increase of about 12 pupils. From one year to the next this creates no great problem. In a 10 year period, however, this becomes a significant number. It would appear that our housing problems are not over and may actually be a matter for continuous study and occasional action.

Candia received this year over \$40,000 in State Foundation Aid, an increase of \$7,000 over last year which reduces the tax assessment. Even this increase is not sufficient to stabilize the tax rate. This legislative year promises better things for education and we hope that significant increases in the present aid program will be given, along with a few new ones. The majority of New Hampshire towns, including Candia, can use more state aid to good advantage.

I would be negligent in my duties as your superintendent if I did not mention the Interim Commission's Report on Education and possible reorganization of supervisory unions and school attendance areas. It is enough at this stage to say that Candia should, through its delegates, study any and all possibilities. Representation on a study committee does not mean approval of anything and many studies are usually necessary before any changes take place if, indeed, changes are made. We expect the Interim Commission's Report to be implemented by legislation. Candia should be vitally interested in these and related matters.

Another matter about which Candia needs to keep an open mind is that of educating its high school youth. As this is being written the matter of increased rates, contracts, etc. are being discussed with the Manchester Board. We hope these problems may be settled to the mutual advantage of all parties. In any event, there is always an answer to a problem. Candia must be interested in co-operation or regional studies, in state laws relating thereto and any other phases concerning education.

Regardless of district organization or the size of a school, the basic success of a pupil depends on himself and his teacher. The hiring of teachers is a most difficult job requiring much wasted effort, time, and money. In fact, little else can be done some years in the spring. We will continue to try to hire the best qualified with the money we have. Candia is becoming more competitive in this respect and it is helpful.

Your co-operation, understanding, and support in the past year are appreciated.

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (2) for a female \$5.00

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-5111

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. 483-7981.

All fires seen an reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
