

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: (L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The following articles to be taken up at 8 P.M.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and seventy five dollars (\$375.00) for the expense of the Red Phone Fire Alarm System and one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of Forest Fire Warden.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow off Mill Pond for skating.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty seven dollars and fifty six cents (\$67.56) to join the New Hampshire Municipal Association or take any action relative thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred twenty five dollars (\$625.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty five hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) for summer roads and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for general expense of highways.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) as a donation to the Rayfond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc. to assist in defraying it's expenses.

14. To see if the Town will vote to repeal the present Zoning Laws of the Town.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$2,333.09 from the Bi-Centennial Committee for the purchase of portable bleachers. Said funds to be expended under the direction of the general Bi-Centennial Committee.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of present State Road Route 101 from the Auburn Town line to the point where relocated Route 101 enters present State Highway. The State Highway Department will continue to maintain this reclassified section of highway until July 1, 1964 or until such time thereafter that relocated section is completed. The approximate distance of reclassified section is one mile.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as have been received this past year.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate by auction acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deed.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6 P.M. due to reopening at 8 P.M. to take action on remaining articles in the Warrant.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention, however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop, extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump—its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- Never discard lighted cigarettes or matches. Make this
 a year round habit regardless of the safety of your
 surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia Qualified to Vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School Auditorium in said District on the 7th day of March 1964, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 6. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$5,700 for the purchase of a school bus.
- 7. To see if the District will vote to raise the sum of \$5,700 for a school bus under Article 6 in the following manner: (a) \$700 thereof by addition to the School Budget for the ensuing year; (b) \$2,900 thereof (or actual balance on July 1, 1964) by withdrawal from the capital reserve fund established for bus replacement; (c) the balance of \$2,100 by the issuance of serial notes covering a period not to exceed three years after the school year 1964-65, upon the credit of the District, and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the serial notes shall be issued, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, as amended.

- 8. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to be made available by the Selectmen prior to June 30, 1964 for support of the schools during the current fiscal year. (Deficit caused by high school tuition.)
- 9. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

For the current year Candia has received over \$60,000 in state aid as follows: Foundation Aid \$50,470.14; Building Aid \$1,874.15; Special Aid \$7,899. Special Aid was voted by the last legislature to be granted to the most needy districts and is most welcome. Total aid received during 1962-63 was \$41,388.02. It is obvious that Candia will benefit from any program of state aid based on need.

Our school enrollment continues upward at a regular pace. As of December 6, 1963 we had registered 340 pupils but had an active membership of 330. This increase is not as great as in the previous year but one should not predict what the rest of the year, or next, will produce. Pre-school census figures show an average well over 40, indicating no let-up in over-all enrollments.

The State Board of Education has already started to reorganize the supervisory unions and are continuously studying this complicated problem. It is safe to guess that most unions will be affected over a period of years. The big questions are when and how much?

There is no way for us to know what the tuition rate at Manchester will be next year. We have estimated it at \$490.00 and hope we will be close to the actual figure. Obviously, we could be wrong by several thousand dollars. This does not create a good budget.

Teachers, qualified by training and experience, do not exist in sufficient quantity to fill our annual vacancies. This is particularly true for the lower grades. Although there are more teachers graduating this year, the demand is expected to exceed the supply. The southeastern corner of New Hampshire is growing rapidly and the battle for teachers

is a vigorous one every year. We need to be highly competitive.

Much research is being done in education in many fields and many experiments are being tried. However, in this area it would seem that we will be doing well if we can provide proper spaces, capable teachers, and make good use of each.

Your support and understanding are appreciated.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spaded female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by July 1st there is an added fee of 50 cents.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. 483-8560.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hamp-shire. Forestry, and Recreation Dept.
