TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, N. H., in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. The money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of the American Legion Post.
- 5. To see of the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for Fitts Museum. The money to be expended under the direction of the Trustees.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the maintenance and development of Moore Park.
- 7. To see of the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred seventy five dollars (\$375.00) for the expense of the Red Phone Fire Alarm and one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the replacement of the present street light on pole #6, route 107A next to the firehouse with one 7500 lumen light and appropriate bracket, also to install one 7500 lumen light, same as above, on pole #6½, route 107A east of the firehouse. Total cost to be one hundred twenty dollars (\$120.00) annually.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to which the State will contribute twenty five (\$25.00) to clear forest fire roads. The money to be expended under the direction of Forest Fire Warden.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to plow off Mill Pond for skating.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty seven dollars and fifty six cents (\$67.56) to join the New Hampshire Municipal Association or take any action relative thereto.
- 12. To see of the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) as authorized by RSA 31:4, Par. XIX for the annual budget of the Merrimack Valley Region Association. On petition of:

- 13. To see of the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for summer roads and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for general expense of highways.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc. to assist in defraying it's expenses.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as have been received this past year.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate by auction acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deed.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt amendments to the Town Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board and on file with the Town Clerk. (By State law this matter is printed on and voted by means of the official Town ballot.)

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the Budget not already acted upon, and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6 P. M. due to reopening at 8 P. M. to take action on remaining articles in the Warrant.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy—both industrial and recreational—is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area-4,350,000 acres-is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
- 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

On the advice of the State Board of Education, we have not figured in the Special Aid to Education as it may not be available for 1965-66.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

For the current year Candia has received state aid as follows: Foundation Aid \$54,531.21; School Building Aid \$1,683.06; Sweepstakes \$10,307.88; Special Aid \$7,899; total aid of \$74,421.15. Total received in 1962-63 was \$41,388.02, and last year was \$60,243.19. It may well be that the Sepical Aid will not be available and that increased Foundation Aid will more than make up the difference.

We expect an enrollment next year of over 350 pupils, necessitating the use of all 14 classrooms, and in 1966-67 we expect to be short one room. The people in Candia will then be at an educational crossroads, with several possibilities: 1. Continue to build the minimum space necessary; 2. Build to incorporate spaces for a widened educational program; 3. Build for either of the above plus a new kitchen and cafeteria; 4. Join a co-operative school which might take any of several organizational patterns. Each of these solutions, and there well may be more, require considerable thought and detailed study. This is particularly true of any co-operative school study, since the law is not simple, and there are many possible combinations of districts, grades, formulas, etc. At the moment, willingness to study and learn about all of these possibilities is the main consideration. Solutions will not be easy or inexpensive. Any decision will affect the education of the children of Candia.

This is a legislative year, and Candia should keep its eye on all things financial. Better still would be organized representation at committee hearings when bills which might affect Candia are being discussed.

Your continued support of the schools is appreciated.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by July 1st there is an added fee of 50 cents.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from George W. Beane, Forest Fire Warden, Candia, Tel. 483-8560.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
