THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the fourth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

You are also notified to meet on Friday, the seventh of March, next at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening at Moore School Auditorium to consider the following articles:

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) toward the purchase of the new fire truck by the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, said funds to be expended under the direction of said Association.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. These funds to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for Memorial Day. The money to be expended under the direction of American Legion Post #91.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) for the Red

Phone Fire Alarm System. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for general expense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump or take any other action relative thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) to defray approximately six months expenses associated with a combined Sanitary Land Fill Operation with the Town of Deerfield to replace the existing Candia dump.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Seventy Eight Dollars and Twenty Eight Cents (\$878.28) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute Five Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty Five Dollars and Seventeen Cents (\$5,855.17).
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc., to assist in defraying its expenses.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for operating expenses of the Candia Recreation Association. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to defray the balance of expenses associated with revaluation by Department of Revenue Administration as voted by the 1974 Town Meeting.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote, if Article 13 is adopted, to raise the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) specified therein by applying funds received from Federal Revenue Sharing.

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Federal Revenue Sharing monies the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to fund a dental program known as Operation Tooth Fairy for under-privileged grade school children. Said monies to be matched in like amount by the State of New Hampshire and expended under the direction of the Candia Overseer of Public Welfare.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) so that the Senior Citizens of Candia may join the Ray-Fre (Raymond-Fremont) Senior Citizens group thereby being able to share in the expenses of that Center: on petition of Myrtle E. Syria and thirty-eight other citizens.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received this past year.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer, or dispose of by sale, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE CANDIA VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The year 1974 has seen the department grow to a strength of 43 regular members and 20 associate members — more personnel to assist when the need arises.

Considering the high fire hazard period experienced in Rockingham County this past summer, we are fortunate enough to answer but 19 local calls, one of which was a false alarm. We wish to thank you for your cooperation in helping produce this fine safety record. Because of this and the fact of the department having improved equipment, the New Hampshire Board of Fire Underwriters has now seen fit to lower fire insurance rates for many sections of town.

Our new fire truck should be received soon and we need your continued financial support. We are attempting to maintain the department on a self-sufficient basis; thereby keeping our tax rate down, but it is simply not possible to do so on the proceeds of the 4th of July celebration only.

We respectfully ask for your continued support in 1975 — our 50th anniversary.

1974 REPORT OF THE POLICE CHIEF

This is the tenth annual report of the Candia Police Department that I am privileged to present.

Our Department received and acted on 1,088 calls in 1974, a 24% increase from 1973.

The rising level of crime is an alarming and complex problem which does not lend itself to quick or easy remedy.

It is far more economical in nearly every instance to prevent crime rather than to solve it. I am very concerned about our efforts as citizens to reduce the opportunities for crime.

I wish to emphasize that many burglaries might never have occurred had all doors and windows been locked, a light left on, valuables secured, keys removed from unattended vehicles, etc. Remember to notify the Department if you are going away for any length of time.

If you see anything suspicious, no matter how trivial, notify the Police Department immediately.

To broaden our knowledge of good law enforcement, members of this Department continue to receive training through various programs. In October, I attended the Medico-Legal Forensic Seminar at the University of New Hampshire. The information I received will be very useful in homicide investigations.

In closing, I extend my sincere thanks to all the citizens of Candia, in particular, my fellow police officers and the Board of Selectmen for their active support and cooperation.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the

permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CANDIA CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Candia Conservation Commission has been working in several diverse areas during the year, 1974, some of which include the following:

Negotiations for the purchase of an abandoned railroad bed from the Boston and Maine Corporation trustees for a nature trail. Negotiations are still continuing.

Mr. Wendell Berry, Jr., botanist, has classified substantially all of the plant growth on the 40 acre tract on New Boston Road

which is under the direction and control of the commission. The report will be of value for townspeople and science classes of the Moore School who will be invited to utilize the tract for nature studies.

Mr. Leonard Chace attended the Ninth Annual Meeting of the Municipal Conservation Commission in Keene and attended a seminar on the dredging and filling of wetlands. The commission is required to investigate all applications for dredge and fill permits.

Mr. Bruce Larson attended a Conservation Restriction Seminar at the UNH campus which dealt with economic, tax and legal problems in establishing conservation restrictions on private land.

Progress is continuing on the open space indexing and watershed delineation for the Lamprey River which has been requested by the state.

The commission plans to concentrate on the improvement of the New Boston Road parcel in order to encourage townspeople to visit and enjoy the botanical classification done by Mr. Berry.

Once again the commission welcomes interested members of the public to attend our meetings which are held the 1st Monday of every month at the Smyth Library.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia, County of Rockingham and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School, in said Town of Candia, in aforesaid County and State, on the fifth day of March, 1975, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the District.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers or agents of the District.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for the purpose of study, investigation and planning for a school building expansion program.
- 9. If Article 8 is voted, to see if the District will vote to change the purpose of the present Capital Reserve Bus Purchase Fund from the purchase of a bus to the purpose of Building Construction and Modification, said fund thereafter to be known as "Capital Reserve Building Fund."
- 10. If Article 9 is voted, to see if the District will vote to construct and equip a new classroom and to appropriate toward said construction the balance in the Capital Reserve Building Fund, including interest accrued to June 30, 1975 (\$4,741.90).

- 11. If Article 10 is voted, to see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Three Hundred Dollars (\$3,300.00) to be added to monies appropriated from the Capital Reserve Building Fund to complete the construction and equipping of a new classroom, and to authorize the School Board to to take all action necessary or desirable to construct and equip said classroom.
- 12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to continue studying the feasibility of the N.H. Educational Voucher Plan as it would apply to Candia, said School Board to make a recommendation to be voted on at the annual school district meeting in 1976.
- 13. To see what sum of money the School District will vote to raise and apppropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officers and Agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.
- 14. To see if the voters will authorize the School Board to accept on behalf of the District, any Federal or State funds designed to improve educational opportunities. Further, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

As we look toward the 1975-76 school year, we are faced with considerable problems occurring through Federal (Equal Educational Opportunities and Civil Rights) and State (Handicapped Child) legislation which will have an educational and financial impact on local school districts.

Another area in which the District is involved is Staff Development. Basically, it is a local plan for the recertification of professional staff members. This master plan must be approved by the State Board of Education and put into operation by July 1, 1975. Currently, the three communities of Auburn, Candia and Hooksett are finalizing their plan as a single unit for implementation.

Due to a delay in funding at the Federal level, the Voucher Project's study and planning grant will not be ready for the 1975 March meeting. The study and planning grant will take place through the remainder of this year and be finalized before being presented to the voters of the District in March of 1976.

Needless to say, the burden of the tax dollar will be affected by the rising cost of energy. Not only in power and fuel, but many of the other materials used in school now show an appreciable increase — mainly paper, texts, work books, etc.

Our conservation measures put into practice this past year have been excellent. Some examples of what has happened; centralized bus stops, cutting down on lights used in buildings, refraining from the use of all exits, adjusting our school calendar, using both sides of school paper, limiting access to paper towels, thermostat control and many other practices.

A new program which has been well received by the District is Driver Education for high school students residing in Candia. The current program is self supporting. Students pay \$35.00 and the State pays \$50.00 per student for a total of \$85.00 which covers the cost of teacher and supplies. Under the fine guidance of Mr. Doug McDonald, the program has had an excellent beginning.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all the members of the community for their support of the educational process, the School Board for the many hours dedicated to serve the needs of the students and to the Staff for their interest in the educational welfare of each student.

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NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00.

Certificate of Rabies shot must be presented when registering dogs.

BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, camp@res, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from Donald W. Seward, Forest Fire Warden, Candia. Tel. 483-8629.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
