# THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the second day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To vote by ballot on changes in zoning proposed by the Planning Board.
- 4. To vote by ballot on expanding real estate exemptions for certain elderly persons, pursuant to R.S.A. 72:43B & C.

You are also notified to meet on Friday, the fifth of March, next at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening at Moore School Auditorium to consider the following articles:

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$5,600.00) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. These funds to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) for the Red Phone Fire Alarm System. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for general ex-

pense and maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eighty Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00) for care and maintenance of the Town Dump or take any other action relative thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote, if Article 8 is adopted, to raise the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) of the amount specified therein by applying funds received from Federal Revenue Sharing.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Sixty Eight Dollars and Six Cents (\$868.06) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute Five Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Seven Dollars and Eight Cents (\$5,787.08).
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc., to assist in defraying its expenses.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for operating expenses of the Candia Recreation Association. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Federal Revenue Sharing monies the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to fund a dental program known as Operation Tooth Fairy for under-privileged grade school children. Said monies to be matched in like amount by the State of New Hampshire and expended under the direction of the Candia Overseer of Public Welfare.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for continued benefits of the Senior Citizens of Candia in the Ray-Free Senior Citizens. On petition of Myrtle E. Syria and 15 other citizens.
  - 15. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of

the following town officers: the Tax Collector from One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00); the Treasurer from Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) to Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00); each per annum, effective upon passage.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to enlist the services of the Department of Revenue Administration of the State of New Hampshire to assist them in performing appraisal maintenance for the ensuing year and raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) to defray the expense associated therewith.
- 17. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following resolution:

"Whereas, certain areas of Candia are subject to periodic flooding from streams and rivers, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

Whereas, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

Whereas, it is the intent of this Town Meeting to require the recognition and evaluation of flood and/or mudslide hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood and/or mudslide hazards; and

Whereas, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to N.H. RSA Chapter 31, 36, 156, 156A,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that this Town Meeting hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it intends to enact and maintain in force for those areas having defined flood hazards, adequate land use and control

measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

- 2. Vests the Planning Board with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
- (a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.
- (b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.
- (c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain or mudslide areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- (d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of flood plain management measures.
- 3. Appoints the Building Inspector to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.
- 4. Intends to take such other official action within its powers as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program."
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to close the road known as Old Chester Turnpike from the intersection of Hemlock Drive to the intersection of Tower Hill Road.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to close the road known as Crowley Road from the house of Leonard and Brenda Ferron to the intersection of Lane Road.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town to accept and expend such funds as are made available to Candia under CETA Title VI (Emergency Employment Act) and the Rural Development Act of 1972, Title IV.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to designate Libbee Road from South Road to Flint Road as Scenic under the provisions of RSA 253: 17 & 18 for the purposes of protecting and enhancing and enhancing the scenic beauty of Candia. By petition of Frances M. Sargeant and eleven other citizens.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to designate Pine Hill Road from South Road to Route 101 as Scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18 for the purposes of protecting and ing the scenic beauty of Candia. By petition of Frances M. Sargeant and eleven other citizens.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to remove the following Selectmen: John B. McQuaid, Arthur H. Sanborn, and Harrington Smalley and to accept nominations and vote for their replacements.

25. To see if the Town of Candia will vote, by a yes or no ballot, to create, establish, and maintain a Town Mosquito Control District under the provisions of RSA 437-A of New Hampshire State Laws. The boundary of the District shall be the boundaries of the Town. The goal is to try to eliminate breeding conditions for mosquitoes. Joint efforts with neighboring towns will be encouraged. Any Town Mosquito District funds would be a part of a proposed budget to the local govern-

ing body of the city or town where the control district is located. Each town decides on whatever it wishes to raise and appropriate for its abatement program. By petition of Hermann N. Sander and ten other citizens.

- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty Seven Dollars (\$47.00) for White Pine Blister & Rust Control by Department of Resources and Economic Development.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received this past year.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 29. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer, or dispose of by auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 30. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF THE POLICE CHIEF

This department received and acted upon 1,491 calls in 1975.

The police of our town has one of the most sensitive and complex responsibility in our entire system of government. Our mandate, always in critical democratic balance, is to preserve social order while, at the same time, guaranteeing essential individual freedom and values. Translated into daily activities, the police officer must reduce crime. In a small town such as ours, we constantly seek the cooperation of the townspeople to help by keeping their eyes and ears open to unusual and suspicious persons or actions, and report them to this department immediately, which could cause the apprehension of criminals, but always in accord with due process principles, the timely and equitable administrations of justice.

I am extremely concerned about recent developments in this country which have imposed new and dangerous burdens on our local police. Harassment and outright attacks against the police, in many instances by subversives and criminals, have increased alarmingly. Court decisions have placed unreasonable restrictions on the forces of law and order, while freeing many criminals from prison and imposing only the mildest of sentences on others. It is for these reasons that there is an organization called "SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL POLICE." I urge all responsible citizens in this community to work with us, as in the past, and accept their responsibility to the local police, to

defend them against unjust attacks, make them proud and secure in their vital profession, and to offer them your support in word and deed whenever possible.

A policeman stands between the law abider and the law breaker. Try to imagine what would happen if there were no policemen around, then try to think of ways to make their job more rewarding, show them the respect they should really have. His job may sometimes seem routine, but the interruptions can be moments of terror. He's the man who faces the half-crazed gunman, who rescues a lost or injured child, who challenges a mob, and who risks his neck more often than you realize. He deserves your respect and profound thanks.

In closing I would like to give my sincere thanks to the citizens in our town for their support and cooperation in the past year. I would like to thank and commend my fellow officers for their many hours devoted to this department, I would also like to extend my thanks to the Raymond Ambulance for their excellent services to this department in 1975.

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assist all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CANDIA CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Candia Conservation Commission has continued work on the 40 acre tract of land on New Boston Road, which is under the control of the Commission. The bridge across the brook has been repaired and all the plant specimens have been mounted, for use by any interested Candia people. The Commission also has a detailed map of all wet soil conditions in town. To our surprise no use was made of it during the recent revaluation of the land in town.

The Commission is introducing into the Warrant this year two Articles for Scenic Roads under RSA 253: 17-18. We have picked two Class 6 roads that do not have any developments on them. The land owners along these roads for the most part are favorable to designating them Scenic. They feel that by protecting the trees and walks along these roads they will be protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Candia. Designating a Road Scenic does not prevent work on the road nor do you lose TRA funding either. What it does do, is enable the people of Candia to have a voice in how their roads should look; big, wide, treeless roads or adequate wall lined and tree lined roads. In some sections of town, trees may be removed to open up vistas of surrounding hills, etc. This will be a small start in what we hope will be a continuing effort to keep the rural charm of Candia intact.

# Nursing

Skilled Nursing is available in the home by Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses which includes dressings, injections, special treatments, baths and rehabilitative nursing under the direction of the patient's physician. Homemaker—Home Health Aides assist under the direction of the nurses and therapists.

# Therapy

Registered physical, occupational and speech therapists are available for therapy at home. Social worker and nutritionist consultants have been added to the staff this year.

### Pre and Post Natal Advice

The nurse is prepared to give advice and guidance to expectant mothers as well as instructions after the baby is born.

Immunization clinics are held periodically during the year and nurses are available at monthly drop in centers, to take blood pressure readings.

# Policy

This agency is voluntary and non profit and is certified to care for Medicare patients. Although many of the services are paid for through Medicaid, Medicare and other health insurances, there is a fee which is discussed on the initial visit. Adjustments can be made. There is no charge for maternal and child health visits made by the nurses. To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Candia, County of Rockingham and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Moore School, in said Town of Candia, in aforeseaid County and State, on the fourth day of March, 1976 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
  - 5. To choose two Auditors for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see if the District will appropriate \$415,000.00, or any other sum for (1) constructing and equipping an addition to Moore School including a Gymnasium and (2) making alterations to the Moore School and to determine whether such appropriations shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise, or to take any other action relative thereto.
- 7. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 8. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers or agents of the District.
- 9. To see if the District will hold to adopt the Education Voucher Program for the school year 1976-77 in accordance with the rules and regulations of the program as they exist and as they may from time to time be amended by the State Board of Education; approving individual voucher value as follows for the school year 1976-77:

Basic Elementary	\$1,004.00
Basic Secondary	1,342.00
Special Education Elem.	1,386.00
Special Education Sec.	1,852.00
Vocational Education	1,704.00

Raising and appropriating the sum of \$200,375.00 to fund the Education Voucher Program; and authorizing the School Board to do all things necessary, including the right to receive and expend all federal and/or state funds available to the District under the program, including also the right to enter into agreements with the State Board of Education in order to implement the program as set forth above.

- 10. To see if the voters will authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept on behalf of the District, up to \$5,000.00 from the Rockingham Stratford Manpower Administration and to expend the same for such projects as the School Board may designate.
- 11. To see if the School District will vote to allow approximately \$3,400.00 remaining in the School Building Study, Investigation and Planning Account to be used for general support of schools during the 1975-76 fiscal year.
- 12. Supplemental Appropriation: To see if the District will vote to direct the School Board to make application for, receive and expend \$2,814.75 for a Nonfood Assistance Grant from the State of New Hampshire during the 1975-76 school year.
- 13. To see what sum of money the School District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officers and Agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.
- 14. To see if the voters will authorize the School Board to accept on behalf of the District, any Federal or State funds designated to improve educational opportunities. ### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The format of my report for the 1974-75 school year, in conjunction with the Chairman of SERESC is more specific in nature and has a direct bearing upon the community of Candia as well as other communities within the State.

It is our responsibilty to help the handicapped. Moreover, it is required by state law. In New Hampshire, there is inadequate state money needed to do the job for these 'special needs pupils' whether they live in poorer or wealthier towns. This puts local school boards in a "bind": its moral and legal responsibility to provide vs. its ability to do so.

What is required by the law and can we possibly comply with it?

The law applies to handicapped children from birth to age 21.

Handicapped conditions are those which reduce a person's capacity for education or ultimate self support. They fall into the areas of *physical*, *intellectual* and *emotional*.

These categories are not necessarily distinct, they may overlap and blend into each other. Each child's 'special need' is somewhat different and often involved help from a number of supplemental personnel and special education teachers — requiring a team effort from 'multi-disciplines.'

The law places particular responsibility upon schools to protect the rights of pupils and parents through fair and regular evaluation of pupils, parent permission prior to any special change in placement or program and process by which decisions may be appealed.

All in all, these are heavy legal requirements added to our moral responsibility and, except for foresight, planning and steps already taken, we might be totally unready and inadequate to the task.

Two years ago, eight school superintendents, including myself, began meeting with Arthur Jillette, of the State Department of Education, Special Education Section. Recognizing the unmet needs of many handicapped children, and in anticipation of the new law, they concluded that the best way to attempt to meet the challenge was through a joint effort.

Seven superintendents, with a planning grant, formed a non-profit corp. called the Southeastern Regional Education Service Center (SERESC) of which they and seven school board members were the Board of Directors. It has been my privilege to have Mr. Hughin Holt as representative of Supervisory Union #15 — Raymond — serve as Chairman of SERESC's Board of Directors.

The top priority for this year would be to provide extended testing services to schools through referral to SERESC. Representatives of most of the member school districts met periodically during the year and the summer, to develop comprehensive processes for the referral, evaluation and placement of pupils which were in compliance with the complex federal laws and state guidelines.

At the present, staff members from the various SERESC areas who have responsibility for coordinating special education programs are meeting periodically to plan for the next phase of SERESC's operations beginning next September. An effort will be made to develop more and better special education programming within the many SERESC school districts. Many pupils who do not now have adequate special help will then receive it in their own or a nearby school district. A number of children who are now attending special schools away from their homes will be brought back into new programs in the area.

Using Federal Funds channeled through the state and SERESC there will be a concerted effort to find pre-schoolers, who need service. If we are to maximize the opportunities for these children to lead the best and most productive lives possible we must intervene and get the best help to them at an early age.

In my opinion, the District of Candia has taken significant stride in the solution of problems faced by the handicapped child and his parent.

### NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registartion number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00.

Certificate of Rabies shot must be presented when registering dogs.

### BURNING REGULATIONS

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

### In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and property constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from Brien E. Brock, Forest Fire Warden, Candia. Tel. 483-2276.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
