TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Moore School Auditorium in said Candia on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

You are also notified to meet on Wednesday, the ninth of March, next at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening at Moore School Auditorium to consider the following articles:

3. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Board of Selectmen to replace the recently appointed Town Counsel, Attorney Edward D. Wynot, due to the possibility of a future conflict of interest. On petition of

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to require the Selectmen to advertise all highway and road construction, and improvements thereon, for bid and to accept no less than three (3) bids for same. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.
 - 5. To see if the Town will vote to choose a chief of police

pursuant to the provisions of RSA 41:2. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.

- 6. If the preceding article is accepted by the Town, to choose a police officer for the ensuing year who shall perform the duties prescribed by law and shall in addition serve as Chief of Police under the Selectmen and exercise authority over and supervise other police officers as provided in RSA 105:1, the compensation and expenses of said Chief of Police to be provided for in the Town budget prepared by the Selectmen and voted by the Town. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Board of Selectmen to reduce the assessments of all real property in the Town, excluding that real property owned by Charmingfare Associates, Inc., by 25% said percentage corresponding to that percentage of reduction in assessed value already received in 1976 by Charmingfare Associates, Inc. Rationale: If the State Tax Assessors were so in error in this case, the entire Town must have been over assessed accordingly. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to elect by written ballot the members of the Candia Planning Board beginning at the Town Meeting of 1978 as provided in RSA 36:4. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to elect by written ballot the members of the Candia Board of Adjustment beginning at the Town Meeting of 1978 as provided in RSA 31. On petition of Rudolph J. Kobel and 11 other citizens as listed in Article 3.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$6,950.) for operating expenses of the Smyth Public Library for the ensuing year. These funds to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) for the Red Phone Fire Alarm System. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) for general expense and maintenance of the apparatus and equipment. The money to be spent under the direction of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Sixty Three Dollars and Sixty Six Cents (\$863.66) for Town Road Aid, to which the State will contribute Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars and Seventy Three Cents (\$5,757.73).
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as a donation to the Raymond Ambulance Fund Association, Inc., to assist in defraying its expenses.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.) for operating expenses of the Candia Recreation Association. The money to be spent under the direction of the Association.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the support of the Ray-Fre Senior Citizens Center. On petition of:

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to enlist the services of the Department of Revenue Administration of the State of New Hampshire to assist them in performing appraisal maintenance for the ensuing year and raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.) to defray the expense associated therewith.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to dispose of the present police cruiser and purchase a new police cruiser and to appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Six Hundred and Six Dollars (\$5,606.00) therefore, said purchase and disposal to be under

the direction of the Chief of Police, with the approval of the Selectmen, with any monies received from such disposal to be paid into the general funds of the Town.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town to accept and expend such funds as are made available to Candia under the Rural Development Act of 1972, Title IV.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$320.00) to fund labor, equipment and materials to conduct a Mosquito Breeding Site Survey during the summer of 1977 and report the findings to the governing body, Mosquito Control District, and the citizens by September 15, 1977. The above funds would be part of the town budget.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to designate Adams Road, from South Road to Route 101, as Scenic under the provisions of RSA 253: 17 & 18 for the purposes of protecting scenic beauty of Candia. By petition of:

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Planning Board to limit subdivision approval to six (6) units or less for each subdivider, for a period of one year commencing March 8, 1977 to minimize and control the impact on the increased cost of Town services including schools, road maintenance, fire and police protection and health services, thereby preventing an undue financial burden on the inhabitants of the Town, and to enable Town officials to formulate and propose for consideration by the Townspeople ordinances de-

signed to protect and preserve the rural character, ecological and scenic values, and financial stability and public health and welfare of the Town.

- 23. To see if the Town of Candia will vote to become a member of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission. The objectives of the Commission are to provide for and encourage regional planning analyses; promote a consensus on problems of regional concern; and assist with implementation of projects located within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of member communities. The Commission has only such authority as conferred on it by RSA Chapter 36: Sections 45-53, of 1955, as amended, and will serve in an advisory capacity representing the interests of the local governing body. The Board of Selectmen shall appoint two representatives to the Commission from among those nominated by the Planning Board in accordance with State law.
- 24. To see if the Town of Candia will vote to appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Twenty Nine Dollars (\$829.00) (\$.35 per capita) as the Town's share for the operation of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operating expenses, planning studies, technical assistance, and such other programs as may be authorized by the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with such other state and/or federal funds as may be available for planning purposes.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for White Pine Blister & Rust Control by the Department of Resources and Economic Development.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the withdrawal from Anti-Recession Funds (Title II, Public Works Employment Act of 1976) of the sum of One Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$113.00) as a set-off against budgeted appropriation for Town Officers' Expense.

27. To see if the Town will vote the following:

All votes of the Town prior to 1946 which discontinued, or discontinued subject to gates and bars, Town roads and highways are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved and such

roads and highways are hereby declared to be discontinued, or discontinued subject to gates and bars if so voted, irrespective of whether they were laid out by selectmen or became public highways by prescription or otherwise.

- 28. To see if the Town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received this past year.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 30. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer, or dispose of by auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon and authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE

During the year 1976 the police department responded to 1.643 calls for assistance.

The past year has been one of considerable impact and controversy concerning the police department and a great deal of energy has been spent in analyzing the department and its functions. I hope that during this period no one was inconvenienced and that the department lived up to the standard expected of it.

September arrived bringing with it stability to the police department primarily through improved relations between the department and the board of selectmen. Since that time, the police department and the board of selectmen have been working together to improve the efficiency and administration of the department. It should be noted, however, that the period of controversy did have a negative and, hopefully, temporary effect; namely, that the size of this police department went from 13 regular and reserve officers down to 6 regular officers in addition to a matron and the chief. I hope that this condition will only be temporary and that qualified personnel can be found to bring the size of the department back to its former level.

Rarely, if ever, are all of the officers in the department required to be on duty at the same time; however, greater availability and geographical coverage results in quicker response to calls for assistance.

Again this year, we ask for the cooperation of the townspeople to help the department by immediately reporting to this department any unusual and suspicious persons or actions. The department relies on all of the citizens of the town to provide information for the prevention of crimes, deterance of accidental injury, and apprehension of law breakers.

This year the department will be asking for a new police cruiser. The existing cruiser has gone over 80,000 miles since the town purchased it in 1972. I hope that the citizens of the town will support this request while some value still remains in the old cruiser so that it might be sold by bid to help defray the new acquisition cost.

In closing I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the citizens for their generosity and cooperation shown to this department in the past year, and especially to my fellow police officers for the many hours devoted to this department.

The Recreation Association is now at work investigating the possibility of tennis courts and a skating rink at Moore Park. The tennis courts could be installed with the help of Federal Aid which would cover 50% of the cost.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to three year terms.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and in such places as the fire warden deems safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States in the past 20 years.

REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission has met three times during the past year attempting to outline projects to develop the 40 acre lot on New Boston Road into a recreation and nature study center for Candia.

To date we have cleared a pathway through about one half of the property with the help of a few scouts. The Candia troop having cleared the entrance of brush which was burned during a wet spell last summer.

A sign has been made to mark the area and a 50 gallon drum has been labelled for disposal of trash for campers. It is hoped that the citizens will try to keep the grounds respectable and not dump garbage and refuse in the area.

The land has been botanized and plants framed under seran wrap on white cardboard to be displayed in the Bangs Room of the Smyth Library.

The Commission encourages any citizens of the town who are genuinely interested in participating in developing this area to make themselves known as soon as possible. This involves building bridges, clearing grounds for camping and tree farming, bird walks, and labeling trees.

Visiting Nurse Association Report of Service

Nursing

Skilled Nursing is available in the home by Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses which includes dressings, injections, special treatments, baths and rehabilitative nursing under the direction of the patient's physician. Homemaker - Home Health Aides assist under the direction of the nurses and therapists.

Therapy

Registered physical, occupational and speech therapists are available for therapy at home. Social worker and nutritionist consultants have been added to the staff this year.

Pre and Post Natal Advice

The nurse is prepared to give advice and guidance to expectant mothers as well as instructions after the baby is born.

Immunization clinics are held periodically during the year and nurses are available daily between 1:30 - 3 P.M. at the Visiting Nurse Association office and at monthly drop in centers to take blood pressure readings.

Policy

This agency is voluntary and non profit and is certified to care for Medicare patients. Although many of the services are paid for through Medicaid, Medicare and other heatlh insurances, there is a fee which is discussed on the initial visit. Adjustments can be made. There is no charge for maternal and child health visits made by the nurses. Anyone may request the

service by calling the Visiting Nurse office at 622-3781, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 A.M. to 4 P.M. Necessary services are provided on weekends and holidays.

TOWN INCINERATOR

Our new incinerator, voted upon at the 1976 Town Meeting, went into operation on December 22, 1976. The total cost of this project; including one Melrose Bobcat loader, one 40'x40' steel building, site work and the Kelley/Hoskinson Pyrolytic Incineration System (Model 1280/72); is \$78,000.

At this time we are in the process of negotiating a contract with the Town of Auburn for the purpose of incinerating its rubbish. Hopefully, this contract will cover a five year period; contain an escalation clause covering labor, fuel and electricity; and require a two year termination notice. The combined rubbish from both towns will mean the incinerator will be operating five days each week. This is the optimum time of operation to achieve peak efficiency.

The operation of the system was put out to competitive bid with Mr. Lawrence Stevens winning the bid. Anyone interested in the operation is invited to see Mr. Stevens at the site during the following hours:

REPORT OF CANDIA PLANNING BOARD

Our town is experiencing an acceleration in its growth rate. Obviously, this fact has a great potential for change in the character of Candia.

As an example, for the years 1970-75, there was an average of nineteen building permits issued each year. In 1976 alone, over sixty permits were issued.

The Planning Board is concerned with its responsibility to see that the town's inevitable growth takes place in a manner that will preserve its rural character and at a rate which all of its facilities can handle. Because all of the citizens of Candia will be directly effected by whatever changes take place as our population grows, we felt that a report of our activities should be included in the Annual Town Report.

During 1976, we held twelve regular public hearings and approved twenty-eight subdivision applications that created a total of eighty-four lots. In addition, we met on eleven other occasions, either in special session or with subdividers, reviewing site survey plans or making inspections of proposed land subdivision.

We also made some minor changes in the subdivision regulations, making it easier for two-four lot subdivisions to be approved with a minimum of red tape and made changes which required more detailed and specific requirements in the approval of large subdivisions to be sure the best interests of the town are served.

Throughout New Hampshire, community officials have been increasingly concerned with the legality of land controls and their administration. Sometimes it takes experienced attorneys and court action to answer these questions. They now find that the plan and the ordinance are not enough; these must be supplemented by an informed board or commission, a knowledge of state planning statutes, and familiarity with legally sound administrative procedures.

In September and October, the Municipal Training Consortium sponsored a series of lectures on Planning Law for community officials. Each of our members attended one or more of these lectures. The purpose of the series was to provide local officials in N.H. with basic legal guidance so that they can func-

tion more effectively in their town planning positions and can recognize problems that merit professional legal advice.

We have also availed ourselves of the opportunity to work with the Office of Comprehensive Planning in matters dealing with Candia specifically.

CANDIA MOSQUITO CONTROL DISTRICT

The Mosquito Committee met several times during the summer, collecting specimens of mosquito larva in all sections of Candia. This is an effort to catalog the different types of mosquito that breeds in Candia and the best means to eliminate them

Prof. Burger from the Entomologist Dept. at UNH spent one evening with the committee and since no funds were appropriated for this survey Prof. Burger volunteered his services free. Future consultant fees will be \$100.00.

The professor recommended that the most expeditious way of attacking the problem would be to purchase 4 traps for adult mosquitos to determine the extent and kind of mosquitos in this area to rule out or in the existence of any of the dangerous species associated with encephalitis and dog heart worm.

The appropriation needed to complete this survey would be \$220 for the traps and \$100 for the entomologist.

The committee recommends the amount of \$320 to complete the survey for the coming year and enlists any who would volunteer their services.

- 3. application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

CANDIA

During the 1975-76 school year the Candia School Board considered better than 125 agenda issues. They dealt primarily with administration, curriculum and finance.

ADMINISTRATION

The Board, realizing the need for the smooth operation of the school adopted a number of policies for its organization and, also, job descriptions for its personnel. Some of these policies concern themselves with public use of school facilities, school board hearings, student use of school facilities, materials, policies of compliance with Title IX, student transportation, management, line and staff relations, tax sheltered annuities, public right to know law, etc.

The Board and Building Committee have worked diligently toward the goal of providing much needed additional space for the students of the district.

CURRICULUM

In maintaining a continuity within the Candia School, we are each year reviewing the adoption of text books, materials, and equipment for Reading, Math, Science, English, Spelling, Handwriting, Music, etc. In the 1975-76 school year, the district adopted a language arts program which included English, Composition, Grammar, Spelling, and Handwriting.

The staff and principal have been organized into committees to review each year that subject area which will be given budgetary consideration. The State Department of Education has more than willingly worked with the committees in establishing workshops and seminars. We have also attempted to coordinate our Junior High Programs with the High School Programs as they are being offered in Manchester and Raymond.

FINANCIAL

In the number of years that I have served in the district, I have found the School Board to be very conscious of its tax

dollar. This is as it should be. Many areas such as general supplies, transportation, insurance, supplies for operation of plant, furniture, etc. are sent out for bid, negotiated and re-negotiated; keeping in mind getting the best in quality for the lowest possible expenditure. A major concern of mine is that the cost of high school tuition per student is now twice that of the elementary student.

On behalf of the students of the district, I wish to extend my thanks to the Candia School Board, to the capable leadership of Mr. Thompson, Assistant Superintendent of Schools, and Mr. Timothy Sweeney, administrator of the school and to the staff.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00. Certificate of Rabies shot must be presented when registering dogs.

BURNING REGULATIONS STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In Case of Fire - Phone 483-2311

Written permits must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden for all open fires at all times when the ground is not covered with snow.

Permits will not be issued for the kindling of open fires between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless raining.

Permits for grass, brush, campfires, etc. must be obtained on the day burning is to be done.

Permits for screened incinerators and properly constructed outdoor fireplaces may be obtained for the season.

There is no charge for permits which may be obtained from Donald W. Seward, Forest Fire Warden, Candia. Tel. 483-8629.

All fires seen and reported by the fire lookout tower are checked with these permits and any person found to be burning without first obtaining a permit is subject to a fine up to \$200.

Any person found to be burning after being refused a permit because of unsuitable weather is subject to a fine up to \$500.

These regulations are set up by the State of New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Dept.
