

Moore Park

The park continues to be used on a daily basis. The softball/baseball season is over with an all-star team practice continuing. The fence defining the front ballfield will be removed shortly, allowing us to mow the grass and start some maintenance activities on the playing field before the soccer season. The bathrooms are fully functional again. Working with the CYAA, the door for the Doucette Fieldhouse was repaired. Matt Hawes is finalizing his plans for the Eagle Scout sign project. Additional maintenance activities are being reviewed and planned. The electric bills for the park area need to be reviewed for the next budget cycle. The sand pile has been moved and the area covered with compost and seeded with wildflowers. We hope to have a daisy field growing there soon, for the enjoyment of the visitors.

Skateboard Park

The skateboard park users also spent some time cleaning up the trash left over from the winter and are doing a great job of taking care of the park.
