

August 2011

The Candia Recycling Center has land-filled **64.16** tons of MSW during the month of August 2011, with a year to date total of **483.52** tons land-filled. The CRC had land-filled **61.13** tons of MSW during August of 2010, with a year to date total of **464.71** tons land-filled. The CRC had land-filled **69.02** tons of MSW during August of 2009, with a year to date total of **460.09** tons land-filled.

The Candia Recycling Center has land-filled **50.91** tons of C&D debris during the month of August 2011 with a year to date total of **323.05** tons land-filled. The Candia Recycling Center had land-filled **49.07** tons of C&D debris during August 2010 with a year to date total of **294.78** tons land-filled. The Candia Recycling Center had land-filled **68.98** tons of C&D debris during August 2009 with a grand total of **372.94** tons land-filled.

The Candia Recycling Center processed a grand total of **115.07** tons of waste during August of 2011, with a year to date total of **806.57** tons. The Candia Recycling Center processed **110.20** tons of waste during August 2010, with a year to date total of **759.49** tons. The Candia Recycling Center processed **128** tons of waste during August 2009, with a year to date total of **833.03** tons.

Recyclables

Mix paper – 17 bales = **21969** lbs. = **10.85** tons

Cardboard - 6 bales = **5972** lbs. = **2.98** tons

#1-#7 plastics –5 bales = **4411** lbs. = **2.20** tons

Tin cans – 1 bale = **872** lbs. = **.43** ton

Aluminum cans – 1 bale = **519** lbs. = **.26** ton

Glass – 1 haul = **18,240** lbs. = **9.12** tons

Electronics – 1 haul = **6620** lbs. = **3.31** tons

The Candia recycling Center created **30** bales of recyclable material during August 2011 which equaled **58,330 lbs.** or **29.17** tons.

The CRC recycled **60** passenger car tires during August 2011.

The CRC recycled **15** air conditioning units, **6** dehumidifiers and **11** refrigerators during August 2011.

The CRC marketed **17.93** tons of mixed paper which generated **\$2061.78** and **6.56** tons of Cardboard which generated **\$1066.24**, for a grand total of **\$3128.02** during August 2011.

The CRC received payment for **2128** lbs. of #2 natural plastic which was sent out in a consolidation load back in May 2011; this **2128** lbs. generated **\$510.72**.

Moore Park

Repairs were again completed on the new equipment, but the welds have failed again. The vendor is working with us to solve the problem. Acceptance of the donated equipment will be held until the equipment is deemed complete.

The CYAA will be handling the ski program administration again next year. Programs will be available for both young and older children, each at their own facility.
