MARCH 2018

The Candia Recycling Center had land-filled 41.30 tons of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) during March 2018. There was 22.52 tons of C&D debris sent to a C&D recycling facility. There was 63.82 tons of waste processed during March 2018.

Recyclables

<u>Mix paper</u> - 8 bales = 13,094 lbs. = 6.55 tons

 $\underline{Cardboard} - 7 \text{ bales} = 8,902 \text{ lbs.} = 4,45 \text{ tons}$

#1 - #7 plastics -3 bales = 3,487 lbs. = 1.74 tons

<u>Alum. Cans</u> = 2 bales = 1,689 lbs. = .84 tons

<u>#2 natural Plastic</u> -1 bale = 797 lbs. = .40 tons

21 bales = 27,960 lbs. = 16.37 tons

On 3/16 there was **8.36** tons of scrap metal sent out that generated **\$1007.88** in revenue.

On 3/30 there was a load of Mix paper and cardboard sent out, there was 10.24 tons of cardboard that was marketed which generated \$614.40 in revenue. The 12.26 tons of mix paper cost \$183.90 to recycle.

There was **\$1622.28** generated in revenue during March 2018 and for the year, the facility has generated approx. **\$5914**.
