

# TITLE LXIII ELECTIONS

## CHAPTER 669 TOWN ELECTIONS

## Filling of Vacancies

**Section 669:63** 

669:63 Selectmen. – Vacancies in the board of selectmen shall be filled by appointment made by the remaining selectmen. Whenever the selectmen fail to make such appointment, the superior court or any justice thereof, on petition of any citizen of the town, and after such notice as the court shall deem reasonable, may appoint a suitable person to fill the vacancy; provided, however, that if the town has adopted the provisions of RSA 669:61, IV, and a petition thereunder is submitted before the submission of a petition under this section, the provisions of RSA 669:61, IV shall apply.

## **May 2018**

The Candia Recycling Center had Land-filled **76.27** tons of Municipal Solid waste (MSW) during May 2017. The Candia Recycling Center also sent out for recycling **62.09** tons of C&D debris during May 2017. The total amount of waste processed during May of 2017 is **138.36** tons.

23 bales created in May 2018 equal 32,515 lbs or 16.25 tons of recyclables, including the 10.31 tons of glass; there was a grand total 25.56 tons of material recycled.

On 5/11 there was **8.53** tons of cardboard marketed which generated **\$383.85** in revenue.

On 5/19 two loads of Light iron were marketed with a total combined weight of **17.06** tons which generated **\$2513** in revenue.

On 5/18 there were approx. **6267** lbs. of non-ferrous metals marketed generating approx. **\$2279.78** and there were also **10.97** tons of steel cans marketed which generated approx. **\$1273** in revenue.

On 5/19 there were approx. 9737 lbs of Aluminum cans marketed which generated approx. \$6175 and there was approx. 11,373 lbs. of lead acid batteries marketed generating approx. \$3996 and there were also approx. 2083 lbs. of electric motors marketed generating approx. \$260 in revenue.

**RECYCLING** has generated approx. \$16,881 during the month of May 2018 and year to date 2018, though not yet in the system officially, the Candia Recycling Center has generated approx. \$30,311.78 in revenue.
