

#### **SECTION 1. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to provide the contractors who commit to performing winter maintenance for the Town of Candia with sufficient incentive to invest in their equipment and make their time and the equipment available to the town during the winter season. In recognition of both the investment in capital equipment made by each of our contractors and as an incentive to maintain that equipment in a serviceable condition, the Town is committed to paying each eligible contractor a minimum of 5 hours each designated week at the hourly rate established and approved each year by the Board of Selectmen upon recommendation by the Road Agent.

#### **SECTION 2. ELIGIBILITY**

The Road Agent will certify the availability of each winter contractor before November 1<sup>st</sup> of each year and will report to the Board of Selectmen and the Accounting and Finance Director those eligible for Stand By Compensation and the hourly rate they will be paid.

#### **SECTION 3. COMPENSATION**

Beginning the second pay period in November of each year and for the succeeding 20 weeks each eligible winter maintenance contractor will be paid for a minimum of 5 hours each week at the rate determined and certified by the Road Agent. The weekly 5 hour stand by compensation will be reduced by the corresponding number of hours, not to exceed 5, worked during that week.

#### **SECTION 5. APPLICABILITY**

This procedure applies only to the Highway Department of the Town of Candia.

RE: 2022 Operating Budget Recommendations

The most recent budget approved by our board to include \$223,000 for an ambulance service represents, together with previously approved increases, a \$465,766 increase over the 2021 operating budget. To mitigate the impact of the ambulance service, I am recommending that \$223,000 be diverted from the remainder of the ARPA fund not previously dedicated to the fire department's \$131,843 allocation for communications equipment and the amount required for payment of premium pay to those employees and contractors previously deemed eligible. As is presently written and approved, the \$465,764 increase will result in a \$.91 increase in our tax rate. Funding the ambulance service with ARPA funds in 2022 will reduce the increase by 50%, still a \$.45 increase.

To address the \$242,766 increase over last year's budget, I am further recommending the board consider using funds available this year for items budgeted for next year and reducing the 2022 budget accordingly. Examples:

•	Smyth Building Main	11,460

These are but a few examples but taken together they eliminate about  $1/3^{rd}$  of the increase over 2021. I recommend each department head be encouraged to find items in next year's budget that can be paid for this year and to eliminate those items from the 2022 budget.
