Training Highlights

Ongoing training and career development are an important aspect of a professional law enforcement agency and promote employee retention. Slow Down for Summer: Kids at Play

When school is out for summer, it's especially important to prioritize speed safety in neighborhoods and near parks, playgrounds, and other areas where children are likely to be playing. Kids are often unpredictable and may dart into the street without warning, so drivers must stay alert and reduce their speed, even in areas where school zone speed limits are not in effect. Slowing down gives drivers more time to react and can significantly reduce the severity of any potential accidents. Communities can also help by posting seasonal reminders and encouraging safe driving habits. Ultimately, staying mindful of speed during school breaks helps protect children and keeps neighborhoods safer for everyone.

Crypto Caution: Don't Get Scammed with Bitcoin

Scammers are increasingly using Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies to trick people out of their money. These scams often involve fake investment opportunities, urgent payment demands, or impersonation of family members, government agencies or tech support. Since Bitcoin transactions are hard to trace and nearly impossible to reverse, it's a favorite tool for fraudsters. To protect yourself, never send Bitcoin to someone you don't know or trust, especially if they contacted you unexpectedly. Be skeptical of promises of guaranteed returns and verify the legitimacy of any investment platform before using it. Avoid clicking on suspicious links in emails or messages and enable two-factor authentication on your crypto accounts. Remember, no legitimate organization will demand payment in cryptocurrency. Stay alert and report any suspicious activity to the proper authorities.



Candia Police Respond to Bicycle vs. Vehicle Crash Involving Juvenile

Candia, NH-On June 26th 2025 at 0916hours, the Candia Police Department responded to a report of a motor vehicle crash involving a juvenile on a bicycle and a passenger vehicle in the area of 168 Patten Hill Rd.

Upon arrival, officers found that a juvenile had been struck while riding a bicycle. The Candia Fire Department and EMS were immediately dispatched and arrived on scene to render medical aid. The juvenile was transported to a Boston Medical by Med Flight for evaluation. At this time, the injuries appear to be non-life-threatening.

The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene and is cooperating fully with the investigation. Preliminary information indicates that speed and impairment do not appear to be factors in the incident.

The crash remains under investigation by the Candia Police Department with the assistance of The NH State Police Collision Analysis and Reconstruction (CAR Unit). No charges have been filed at this time.

Candia Police remind drivers and bicyclists alike to remain vigilant on the roads and to practice safety at all times, especially as summer months bring increased activity in neighborhoods and on local roads.

No further information will be released at this time pending investigation.
