Back to School Means Slowing Down: A Safety Reminder for Our Community

With the school year underway, it's time for all of us—drivers and parents alike—to refocus on safety around school zones, bus stops, and crosswalks. Children can be unpredictable, especially during busy morning and afternoon hours, so reduced speeds are essential to prevent accidents. Drivers should always obey posted speed limits, stay off their phones, and be prepared to stop for crossing guards and buses. Parents can help by teaching children to use crosswalks, look both ways before crossing, and avoid distractions like phones or earbuds while walking. If you're driving your child to school, use designated drop-off areas and avoid double parking. By working together, we can keep our roads safe and ensure a smooth start to the school year for everyone in Candia.



Grandkid and Family Scams

Here's how they work:



You get a call: “Grandma, I need money for bail.” Or maybe an email from someone claiming to be your brother or a friend who says they’re in trouble. They need money for a medical bill. Or some other kind of emergency. The caller says it’s urgent — and tells you to keep it a secret.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they’re not. They can be convincing: sometimes using information from social networking sites, or hacking into your loved one’s email account, all to make it seem more real. And they’ll pressure you to send money before you have time to think.

Here's what to do:

- 1. Stop. Check it out.** Look up your family member’s phone number yourself and call another family member to check out the story.
- 2. Pass this information on to a friend.** You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are, you know someone who will get one — if they haven’t already.

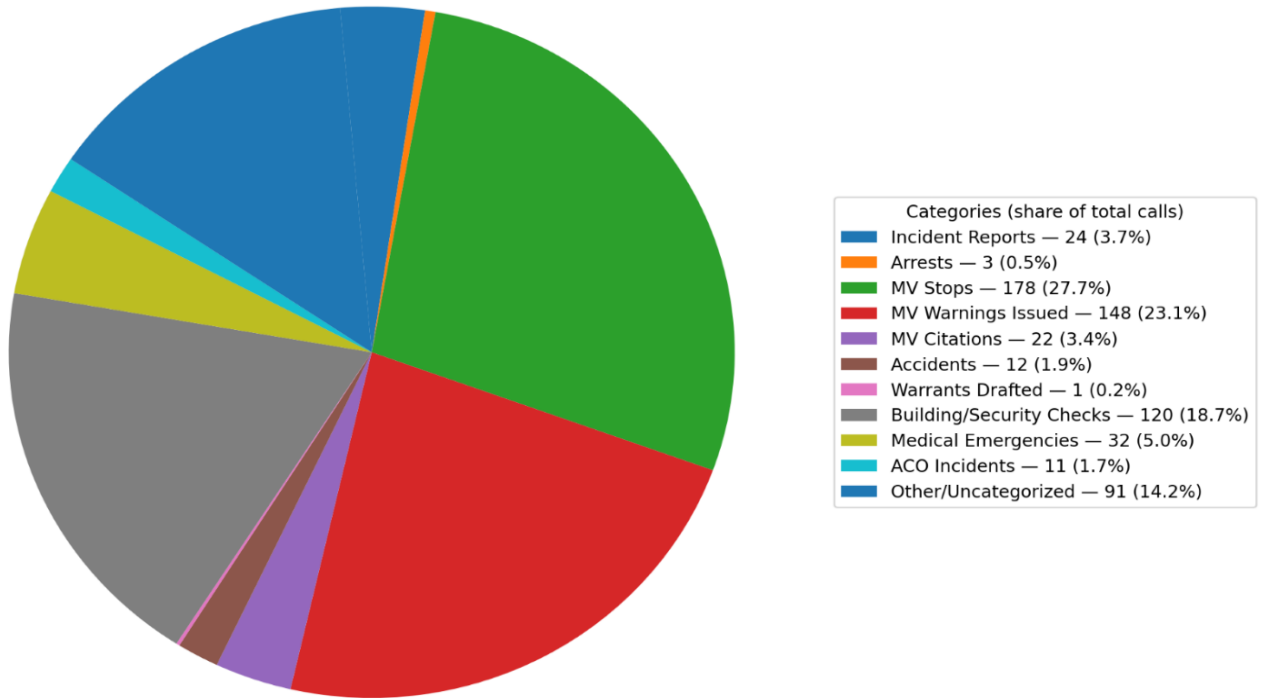
